

How to get to City of Minneapolis Downtown Offices



Map key:

- ④ Haaf Parking Ramp

Driving:

All driving directions are to the Haaf Parking Ramp, the most convenient public parking ramp for City Hall, the Public Service Center and the City of Lakes Building.

from Saint Paul:

Take I-94 West to the 5th Street exit (exit 234B). Follow 5th Street to 5th Avenue. Turn right onto 5th Avenue. The entrance to the Haaf Parking Ramp is directly on your left.

from the western suburbs:

Take I-394 East to the 4th Street North exit. Take a slight right onto 4th Street. Follow 4th Street to 5th Avenue. The entrance to the Haaf Parking Ramp is directly on your left.

from the southern suburbs:

Take I-35W North toward Downtown exits. Merge left, toward the Downtown exits. Take the 5th Avenue exit and continue on 5th Avenue to 4th Street. When you cross 4th Street the entrance to the Haaf Parking Ramp is directly on your left.

from the northern suburbs:

Take I-94 East to the 4th Street North exit (exit 230). Stay straight to go onto 4th Street. Take 4th Street to 5th Avenue. Turn left onto South 5th Avenue, and the entrance to the Haaf Parking Ramp is directly on your left.

By bus or train:

City Hall is located on the Hiawatha Light Rail line (Government Plaza station) and is within walking distance of the Public Service Center and the City of Lakes building. Downtown Minneapolis is also served by buses and the Northstar train. For route and fare information, visit MetroTransit's Web site at www.metrotransit.org or call 612-373-3333.

By bicycle:

Downtown is accessible via 46 miles of streets with dedicated bicycle lanes and 84 miles of off-street bicycle paths. Bike racks are available at City Hall, the Public Service Center and the City of Lakes building. For bike route information, visit www.minneapolismn.gov/bicycles/where-to-ride.asp.
