Message from Council Member Kevin Reich

Every ten years, following the census, the U.S. Constitution requires the redrawing of congressional and state legislative district boundaries to reflect population shifts. The City of Minneapolis Charter similarly requires the redrawing of wards and Park & Recreation districts every year ending in "2" using the most recent census data.

Minneapolis must complete its work within 60 days after the Minnesota Legislature finishes its task or by April 3, 2012. The Charter Commission has responsibility for redrawing the boundaries, with the assistance of a 9-member advisory group. The proposed new maps will be subject to input from the public over the course of at least four public hearings. Once the Charter Commission has approved a final plan, it goes before the Council, who will pass a resolution defining the new precinct boundaries and designated polling places.

The Charter requires the 13 Minneapolis City wards to have populations that are within five percent of the City population divided by 13, to keep them as close in population as possible. Based on the 2010 census, that range is 27,958 to 30,900. Another principle the Charter Commission has established to guide redistricting is an emphasis on keeping communities of interest (those that share common interests such as neighborhood identity, ethnic heritage or specific economic concerns) in one ward when possible.

Public hearings on the first draft maps will be held February 29 and March 1 (click HERE for locations and further information). 

Winter Street Reconstruction

The City of Minneapolis is preparing to reconstruct several blocks of oiled dirt streets between East Hennepin and Winter Street in the SE Como neighborhood. The project, currently in the design phase, includes full removal of the existing surface and approximately 1.0 mile of new pavement, with curb and gutter, sidewalks, driveways, streetscape elements and utility work as needed. Construction is slated to begin in 2013. For questions and

201 Lowry Avenue NE Redevelopment Plan

201 Lowry Avenue, the former Little Jack's restaurant, is a long vacant, tax-forfeited property in the Marshall Terrace neighborhood. A development team proposes to renovate the existing building for a restaurant and/or other commercial use and, in a later development phase, construct new high-density market-rate rental housing on the portion of the property previously used as a surface parking lot. It is proposed that the City of Minneapolis acquire the tax-forfeited property and convey it to the development entity. own bags to the grocery store. If you find that that practice leaves you short of paper bags for separating your recycling, the City of Minneapolis has an alternative for you. You may use wastebaskets, pails or corrugated boxes for separated paper, plastic or cans. These alternative containers should be 10 gallons or less and there must be a city recycling sticker on at least one side of the container.

Frost Building Wins Award of Excellence

For nearly 100 years the Frost Building, in the Northeast Park neighborhood, was home to a paint and linseed oil manufacturing company. This heavy industrial use produced noxious odors and left an immense amount of pollution in the buildings and grounds, including over 100 abandoned tanks of paint, oil and other waste. Today, the Frost Building has been transformed by Hillcrest Development into two floors of warm, light-filled, and functional office space that houses such creative businesses as Modern Survey, Maren Kloppman Ceramics and Patrick Fox Photography. Hillcrest's accomplishment was recently acknowledged when the Frost Building received an NAIOP Minnesota Award of Excellence for 2011.
