Keeping our sidewalks free of ice and snow is the neighborly thing to do ...

Together, we are all responsible for keeping Minneapolis safe and comfortable for winter walking. For yourself, your neighbors and people pushing strollers or using wheelchairs, please do your part.



... and it's the law.

Minneapolis ordinance requires that property owners clear sidewalks after the end of a snowfall within four daytime hours for apartment and commercial buildings; houses and duplexes have 24 hours. Failure to shovel your walk could lead to a ticket plus the cost of City crews shoveling it.

Don't forget your garbage and recycling containers.

Shovel a 36-inch-wide path from your garbage and recycling containers to the street or alley.



City ordinances require this path be cleared for garbage and recycling containers within 48 hours after the snow stops falling. If City crews have to clear them, a fee of \$30 per container will be added to your utility bill.
