**Subject: Request for Permission to Accept a DWI Court Grant from the Fourth Judicial District Court**

**Recommendation:** That the proper officials be authorized to execute an agreement with the Fourth Judicial District Court for a portion of the implementation of an Adult DWI Court in Hennepin County to fund wages for police officers to participate in this new program. The grant award to Minneapolis is \$70,900. The Department requests an amendment to the general appropriation resolution for 2012 in the amount of \$70,900. The grant award will operate through the state grant fund, 01600.
