This matter came before a license settlement conference on Monday, May 13, 2013. Appearing for the department was District Supervisor Patrick Hilden and Lead License Inspector Julie Casey. Appearing for Cosmopolitan Business Solutions LLC, dba Safari Restaurant was Jamal Hashi. Based on the information presented at the hearing the department makes the following findings of fact.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Safari Restaurant was issued administrative citations from Environmental Health on February 4, 2012 in the amount of \$600, April 4, 2012 for \$1400, June 15, 2012 for \$600 and August 24, 2012 for \$600.00.
2. On February 1, 2013 notice was sent indicating that the above listed citations had not been paid. Verbal notice was given to Jamal Hashi concerning the unpaid citation. Mr. Hashi contacted Environmental Health and a settlement was reached that stayed \$1400 of the fines owing.
3. At the license settlement conference, Mr. Hashi requested a six month payment plan to pay the remaining \$1800 of the citations.

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Cosmopolitan Business Solutions, LLC failed to pay \$1800 in administrative citations as required under Minneapolis Code of Ordinances 259.15.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Cosmopolitan Business Solutions, LLC agrees to pay \$1800 in administrative citations in \$300 installation for the next six months. These payments are due by the 15th of each month with the first payment due on May 15, 2013.
- 1. If Cosmopolitan Business Solutions, LLC is given any new citations, they must be paid or appealed by the due date given by the inspector.

Cosmopolitan Business Solutions, LLC understands that the holding of a business or liquor license in the City of Minneapolis is both a privilege and a responsibility. A minimum standard shall be met in order to hold such a license. One minimum standard is that a license holder is responsible to ensure that its business operates in compliance with all applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations. It is understood and agreed that any violation of the above Recommendations shall constitute just and proper cause for the immediate imposition of any stayed penalties. It is further understood that compliance with the above Recommendations is a requirement for continuing to hold a license and that failure to comply with any of these conditions may result in additional adverse license action.

I have read and understand the above findings of fact, conclusions, and recommendations. I agree with their contents and I agree with the above noted Recommendations. I understand that the failure of my business to adhere to this agreement may be cause for further suspension, revocation, or denial of my license. I understand that this report must be accepted and approved by the Minneapolis City Council and Mayor.
