**Background/Supporting Information Attached**

Since 1998 the department has contracted with Hennepin County, as a sub-contractor under their agreement with the Minnesota Department of Human Services, to participate in revenue generation activities as part of the Local Collaborative Time Study (LCTS). The City participates in LCTS through documentation of our provision through the School Based Clinic program of federally-reimbursable administrative and/or case management services designed to help families and children access health or health related services. The use of any federal LCTS funds received through the Department of Human Services and Hennepin County are determined through the Family Services Collaborative (FSC) and the Children's Mental Health Collaborative (CMHC). The department has received LCTS funds over the past few years in support of mental health services for Latino students at Roosevelt High School and is currently funded through January 2014.
