Subject: Local Approval Requirement; Intoxicating Malt Liquor.

A section of the 2013 Minnesota Legislature Omnibus Liquor Bill requires City Council to act on local approval clause authorizing the City of Minneapolis to authorize a holder of an on-sale wine license issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes who is also licensed to sell 3.2 percent malt liquors at on-sale to also sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale without an additional license. *Laws of Minnesota 2013*, Chapter 42, Section 14.

Recommendation:

- Approve laws 2013 Chapter 42 Section 14 as a special law and direct City Clerk to complete and file the needed documentation with the office of the Secretary of State.

**Approving Laws of Minnesota 2013 Legislative Session; Chapter 42,
Section 14**

Whereas the Minnesota State Legislature has passed a law authorizing the City of Minneapolis to authorize a holder of an on-sale wine license who is also licensed to sell 3.2 percent malt liquors at on-sale to sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale without an additional license under authority of Minnesota Statutes section 340A.411;

Whereas, said legislation, by its terms requires an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council by the first day of the next regular session of the legislature before it may become effective; and

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the City Council of Minneapolis:

That the said law be now approved and the City Clerk be directed to prepare and file with the Secretary of State the required certification of approval.
