

**Background/Supporting Information**

Defendant Officer Isaac Raichert entered the home of Terry and Jerome Yzaguirre on December 21, 2011 and towed Jerome Yzaguirre's vehicle. Plaintiff brought a lawsuit alleging unreasonable search and seizure. Defendants' deny these allegations. After global negotiations, a settlement was reached in the amount of \$3,000 and the waiving of towing and storage fees for Yzaguirre's vehicle. The settlement amount has been reviewed and approved by the Litigation Committee. Police Administration has also approved the settlement. Therefore, staff recommends approval of this settlement.
