Supporting Information

The City entered into an agreement with the Tangletown Neighborhood Association (TNA) on May 13, 2013 for the implementation of ten utility box wraps, a community graffiti knowledge survey and youth education on the graffiti as the number one source of damage to property.

TNA has received approval for their list of utility box locations and issued a successful call for artists. They are currently working to involve Washburn High School art students and selecting final images from artists, students, and the City's preapproved designs. The timeline from design selection to installation is approximately three months. Utility box wraps require a steady temperature of 50 degrees Fahrenheit or warmer for proper installation. Approval of this extension will allow for acceptable daily temperatures for proper installation.
