Background/Supporting Information Attached

The health department has been awarded a SHIP Innovative grant from the Minnesota Department of Health to implement a Community Driven Change Initiative that has two components: 1) provide money and technical assistance to neighborhood organizations and cultural communities so they can identify and pursue community-identified projects to increase healthy eating, physical activity and smoke-free living; and 2) engage youth in creating healthier environments through a youth leadership program, Step Up interns and health department involvement in community-based youth groups. The 10% match requirement will be met through other grant resources from the city, and from program partners.
