Subject: AUTHORIZATION TO EXTEND THE MASTER GRANT CONTRACT WITH THE STATE OF MINNESOTA THROUGH ITS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH BOARDS

Recommendation

1. The Council, acting as the Minneapolis Board of Health, in its capacity as a Community Health Board, authorizes the proper City officials to amend the Master Grant Contract #26078 with the State through the Minnesota Department of Health for an additional year for a new grant period of January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2014. Individual projects and funding will be issued under the Master Grant Contract through Project Agreements.
2. The Council, acting as the Minneapolis Board of Health in its capacity as a Community Health Board, authorizes the Commissioner of Health to continue to sign the individual Project Agreements as the Community Health Services Administrator for the City.

Background/Supporting Information Attached

The Department is requesting authorization to amend its five year Master Grant Contract with the State to extend it an additional year. This is the third Master Grant Contract with MDH since 2002, and is intended to reduce administrative burden in contracting between the state and local health departments/community health boards. The Master Grant Contract includes the basic template language

that applies to all grants received from MDH. The City will then receive a Project Agreement for each individual grant program for which we are funded that details the activities, budget, and conditions for the program. The department is also requesting that the Minneapolis Commissioner of Health, acting in the role of Community Health Services Administrator, continue to be authorized to sign the individual Project Agreements as received.
