Supporting Information

Minneapolis' entertainment scene boasts an eclectic array of chic, vibrant, and upbeat bars, lounges and nightclubs. In addition to providing a hospitable

environment for dining and socializing, many offer a place for patrons to enjoy music, dancing and live entertainment.

Without exception, establishments that host live bands or DJs must balance the noise associated with the entertainment and its impact on patrons and the community. While sound barriers can minimize effects to the local area, these enhancements do not protect customers who are vulnerable to irreversible hearing damage.

Staff is recommending requiring all Class A and Class B On-Sale Liquor, Wine and Beer establishments make available personal protective equipment as a means of protecting patrons' hearing without compromising entertainment goals.

Amending Title 14, Chapter 364 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances relating to Liquor and Beer: Liquor Licenses.

The City Council of The City of Minneapolis do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 364 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances be amended by adding thereto a new Section 364.115 to read as follows:

364.115. Entertainment restricted. All class A and Class B On-Sale Liquor, Wine and Beer licensees shall make available hearing protection devices, free of charge to patrons. Such single-use earplugs will have a Noise Reduction Rating (NRR) of at least 30 decibels.
