**Background/Supporting Information Attached**

The Department has been awarded \$43,307 in federal Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) funds through the state. The award continues work that was originally recommended by the Minnesota Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee in 2012 in support of the Broader Urban Involvement and Leadership Development Program (BUILD). The target population for BUILD is youth between the ages of 8-17 years old who are at various stages of gang involvement and affiliation, or those with a high risk of future involvement. The program engages youth in the school and community so they can realize their educational and career potential and contribute to the stability, safety, and wellbeing of their communities. Federal grant requirements for JABG funding include a match, with the City's portion totaling \$2,222. This amount can be accommodated within the department's appropriated budget.
