Subject: **Increase Waste Management of Minnesota, Inc. Contract for Disposal and Hauling of Unregulated Excavation Spoils Piles**

Recommendation:

Authorize execution of Amendment #1 to Contract C-37768 with Waste Management of Minnesota, Inc. to increase the current contract amount by \$250,000 for a new contract amount of \$735,000. Surface Water & Sewers has available funding within existing appropriation in Stormwater Fund 07300.

Previous Directives:

December 13, 2013 Council authorized the acceptance of the low bid of Waste Management of Minnesota, Inc. for Official Publication #7884 in the amount of \$485,000.00 to furnish and deliver all labor, materials, and incidentals necessary for the hauling and disposal of excavation spoils.

Background/Supporting Information:

The City of Minneapolis Surface Water and Sewers is requesting an increase to the existing contract amount with Waste Management of Burnsville for the hauling and disposal of soil from Public Works' spoils pile at Linden Yards.

SW&S has additional funds available to remove additional soil this year under the current contract with Waste Management.

Waste Management has stated that they will honor the current contractual prices for the hauling and disposal of soil for the additional soil amount. Surface Water and Sewers is requesting City Council's approval to increase the contractual amount with Waste Management.
