Subject: Request to Accept Traffic Safety Enforcement Grant Award

Recommendation: That the proper officials be authorized to accept a grant award of \$372,388 and execute the 2015 Toward Zero Deaths grant agreement from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety for traffic safety enforcement. The grant award will operate through the grants - federal and the award was anticipated in the 2014 Police Department annual budget. The Minneapolis Police Department (MPD) requests permission to enter into agreements with the Police Departments of the University of Minnesota, Golden Valley, Crystal, Hopkins, Robbinsdale and New Hope to share the grant funds in amounts to be determined.

Previous Directives: This is an annual program that the Police Department participates in with positive results. This Toward Zero Deaths Enforcement Grant combines the previously separate *Safe & Sober*, Nightcap Impaired Driving and seat belt enforcement programs.

Supporting Information

The Police Department requests permission to accept \$372,388 under the State's Department of Public Safety, Office of Traffic Safety Toward Zero Deaths Grant. This grant is a merger of the previous Safe and Sober and Nightcap grant programs. The grant will be used to pay overtime to Traffic officers to increase enforcement targeting impaired drivers, juvenile and young adult violators, speed violations, seat belt and other enforcement to reduce accidents and increase driver safety as permitted by the grant award. No local grant match is required.

The Police Department is required by the State to partner with other metro agencies for this grant award and has partnered with the police departments from the University of Minnesota, Golden Valley, Crystal, Hopkins, Robbinsdale, and New Hope to share grant funds in amounts to be determined. Formal agreements between Minneapolis as the lead agency and each sub-grantee agency are required in order to share these funds.
