Following a competitive RFP approved by the Permanent Review Committee, Tubman was selected to provide services for Minneapolis youth ages 12-17 who are at risk of involvement with violence. For the purposes of the program, involvement with violence includes being a victim of violence or perpetrating violence. This contract will fund continued intensive one-to-one case management services for 2015, and up to two additional years, for identified youth that will increase youths' protective factors and decrease risk factors, reducing the likelihood of victimization by or perpetration of violence. Services provided include social support, academic support, access to community-based resources, access to positive pro-social activities, and practical skill and soft skill building. Individual case management can have a significant impact for youth with the identified risk factors by providing important resources and referrals, fostering the development of protective factors, and engendering positive relationships with trusted adults. These services are a component of the Health Department's programming for high risk youth, which aligns with the efforts outlined in the Blueprint for Action to Prevent Youth Violence.
