


Impact of School Based Clinics

- Improve Access
 - Adolescents face challenges to accessing necessary care- especially sensitive care and mental health
- Cost Savings
 - Reduce inappropriate ER use
 - Fewer hospitalizations
 - Decrease pregnancies & sexually transmitted infections
- Academic Success
 - Students perform better when they show up to class healthy & ready to learn
- Address health disparities
 - Services target those at risk & at no cost to families




SBC Demographics


Race/Ethnicity




Insurance Types








Parents' Perceptions

Parental support of School Based Clinics has remained strong since surveys to parents were first administered in 2004.



Clinic user feedback

December 2014 User Survey

- 53% use clinic once or more a month
- 97% would recommend the clinic to a friend
- 99% felt they were respected by clinic staff
- 96% felt comfortable asking questions
- 96% said they were able to schedule appointment quickly
