**Subject: Public Hearing: 2015 Resurfacing Program – Powderhorn West Residential**

### Recommendation:

- A. Pass a Resolution ordering the City Engineer to proceed and do the work and adopt special assessments in the amount of \$947,876.83 for the Powderhorn West Residential Project No 5278 Street Resurfacing project.
- B. Pass a Resolution requesting the Board of Estimate and Taxation to authorize the City to issue and sell assessment bonds in the amount of \$947,880 for the Powderhorn West Residential Street Resurfacing project with the bonds to be paid from special assessments.

## **Supporting Information**

### Background

On April 17, 2015, the City Council designated the locations, streets and improvements proposed to be made in the Powderhorn W Residential neighborhood. The cost estimate for this project is \$1,397,796 and is financed by net debt bonds and special assessments (for finance purposes identified as CPV1556POWDER).

The Powderhorn West residential area is bounded by Lake St on the north, Chicago Av on the east, 36<sup>th</sup> St E on the south and 2<sup>nd</sup> Av S on the west. This area was last paved in 1975 and the streets to be paved are local city streets.

The street resurfacing would be a mill and overlay of the street surface with plant mix asphalt and other paving related improvements as needed. This paving project is scheduled to begin in late summer 2015, with curb and gutter work scheduled for June and will be constructed by the City's workforce.

### Special Assessments

The street resurfacing special assessments were determined by applying the 2015 Uniform Assessment Rates to the land area of benefited parcels located within the street influence zone along the improved streets. The approved 2015 resurfacing rates are:

\$0.62/sq. ft. – Non-Residential

\$0.21/sq. ft. – Residential

The proposed total assessment amount is \$947,876.83 for the Powderhorn W Residential project. Individual assessments of more than \$150 would be collected over 5 years beginning on the 2016 real estate tax statements and assessments of \$150 or less would be collected in their entirety on the 2016 real estate tax statements with interest charged at the rate determined by the City Council for the appropriate assessment collection period. Information has been provided in the notices as to how persons may prepay the special assessments in full without interest if they so choose.

City Council has passed resolutions whereby a deferment of special assessments may be obtained by showing hardship for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older or retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability.

**POWDERHORN W RESIDENTIAL STREET RESURFACING PROJECT  
SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT OF EXISTING STREET NO 5278**

**Ordering the work to proceed and adopting the special assessments for the Powderhorn W Residential Street Resurfacing Project.**

Whereas, a public hearing was held on May 19, 2015 in accordance with Article IX, Section 9.6 (c) of the Minneapolis City Charter and Section 24.110 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances to consider the proposed improvements as designated in Resolution 2015R-165, passed April 17, 2015 to consider the proposed special assessments as on file in the Office of the City Clerk and to consider all written and oral objections and statements regarding the proposed improvements and the proposed special assessments;

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Minneapolis:

That the City Engineer is hereby ordered to proceed and do the work as designated in said Resolution 2015R-165, passed April 17, 2015.

Be It Further Resolved that the proposed special assessments in the total amount of \$947,876.83 for the Powderhorn W Residential Street Resurfacing Project No 5278 (Levy 01027, Project No 52785) as on file in the office of the City Clerk are hereby adopted and assessed against the benefited properties.

Be It Further Resolved that the number of successive equal annual principal installments by which the special assessments of more than \$150 may be paid shall be fixed at five (5) and that the interest be charged at the rate determined by the City Council for assessments collected over the aforementioned time period with collection of the special assessments to begin on the 2016 real estate tax statements.

Be It Further Resolved that the number of installments by which the special assessments of \$150 or less may be paid shall be fixed at one (1) and that the interest be charged at the rate determined by the City Council for assessments collected over the aforementioned time period with collection of the special assessments to be on the 2016 real estate tax statements.

## **Reich and Quincy**

**Requesting the Board of Estimate and Taxation to authorize the City to issue and sell City of Minneapolis bonds in the amount of \$947,880 for certain purposes other than the purchase of public utilities.**

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Minneapolis:

That the Board of Estimate and Taxation be requested to authorize the City to incur indebtedness and issue and sell City of Minneapolis bonds for the purpose of paying the assessed costs of street improvements in the Powderhorn W Residential Street Resurfacing Project, Special Improvement of Existing Street No 5278, to be assessed against benefited properties as estimated by the City Council, which assessments shall be collected in five (5) successive annual installments, payable in the same manner as real estate taxes.
