Mississippi Watershed Management Organization Grant for 24th Ave SE Infiltration Project (CSO 56)

Description:

1. Authorizing execution of a grant agreement with the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization to fund up to \$650,000 for stormwater facilities as a part of the 24th Ave SE Infiltration project (CSO 56).
2. Authorizing increase to the appropriation in 7300-9010932-CSW1605STCSO56 by \$650,000 and increasing revenue source 322502 by \$650,000.

Background/Analysis:

The 24th Avenue SE Infiltration Project is a part of the City's Combined Sewer overflow program which works to disconnect drainage from the sanitary sewer system and redirects it to the storm sewer system. In an effort to provide additional stormwater benefit to the project, the 92% impervious, 10.3 acre drainage area in an industrial area will drain to a new infiltration system within public right-of-way. This project takes an innovative approach to the City's combined sewer overflow (CSO) program by utilizing infiltration. It was selected to receive up to \$650,000 in grant funds from the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization through the Capital Project Grant program for the added stormwater components.

The key terms of the grant agreement include the following:

1. City will construct the Project in accordance with Plans and Specifications that are approved the MWMO.
2. City will complete the Project within a specified timeframe.
3. If Grantee retains contractors to construct the Project, the City will advertise for bids, award, and supervise its contracts in accordance with the requirements of law.
4. The MWMO may observe and review the work of the Project until it is completed.
5. Grantee will perform all necessary investigations of site contamination and secure all necessary local, state or federal permits required for the construction of the Project and will not proceed with the Project until any required environmental review and

remediation of site contamination is completed, or a plan for remediation is approved by appropriate regulatory agencies.

6. Upon Completion of the Project, the City will assume responsibility for its maintenance.
