The Minneapolis City Council hereby approves the following ballot language for the police professional liability insurance proposal to be submitted to the electorate as part of the 2016 General Election.

Proposal to Amend the Minneapolis City Charter to Require Police Officers to Maintain Liability Insurance.

“Shall the Minneapolis City Charter be amended, effective November 8, 2017, to require all Minneapolis police officers to have and maintain continuous coverage under individual professional liability insurance policies, such policies to be the primary insurance for the officers and to include coverage for willful or malicious acts and acts outside the scope of the officers’ employment by the City; with the City having the option to reimburse officers for the base rate of coverage, but with police officers being responsible for any additional costs due to personal or claims history; and prohibiting the City from indemnifying a police officer against liability in any amount greater than required by state statute unless the officer’s insurance is exhausted?”
