Line #49b - Find consistent ways to use existing community events and groups to gather and disseminate information (94% approval)

Addition of a Community Engagement Definition

Member-submitted proposal: The Community Engagement Track 2 Task Force Report should include a definition of community engagement developed by the group.

Vote on the addition of Line #D1 (proposed definition) – "Community engagement is the participation of members of a community assessing, planning, implementing, and evaluating solutions to problems that affect them. As such, community engagement involves interpersonal trust, communication, and collaboration. Such engagement, or participation, should focus on, and result from, the needs, expectations, and desires of a community's members. Community is not solely defined by geographic boundaries and may include residents, users, community organizations and institutions, neighborhood associations, businesses and workers, cultural communities, advocacy groups, students and youth."

(reference information about the definition provided by its author - here is a definition of community engagement that I think integrates the spirit of definitions previously submitted by other members. I'm suggesting this text be included in the very beginning of the Core Principles section prior to any of the principles, their qualities or associated recommendations.)

Merging / rewrite Lines #53 & #63 - The constituents of the group should have access to the decision-making process and/or control of the organization so that the organization's work reflects the constituent's desires.

Placed in Characteristic of COs section

Line #53 - on the table for discussion with a 47% approval rating - Represent, and provide for the participation of, the interests of all segments of the entire community, including, but not limited to, homeowners, renters, property owners, business owners, immigrants, non-English speakers, low-income residents and communities of color. Groups that primarily represent the interests of one segment of the community or concentrate primarily on one issue are not eligible.

Line #63 - *in the report with 67% approval* - Members of the community organization have access to decision making and/or control of the organization so that what the organization is doing is driven by the constituents desires.
