Background/Supporting Information:

History

The Minneapolis stormwater management program endeavors to improve the water quality of Minneapolis lakes, streams, wetlands and the Mississippi River, with the ultimate goal of preservation and enhancement of our natural and historic environment, while concurrently fulfilling regulatory requirements. The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) is a program created in 1990 by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to protect water quality through the regulating of discharges of pollutants to lakes, streams, wetlands and other surface waters. As a municipality with a population greater than 100,000, Minneapolis is permitted under Phase 1 of the Federal stormwater requirements. Under this program, specific permits are issued in an effort to regulate municipal and industrial activities. Minneapolis maintains two distinct NPDES permits: the Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) Permit that regulates combined storm and wastewater discharges from the sanitary sewer system, and the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit that regulates stormwater runoff discharges from the storm drain system. The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), under a delegation agreement with the EPA, issued the first NPDES MS4 Permit (Permit) to the City and the MPRB on December 1, 2000. The Permit requires the implementation of stormwater management activities that are designed to mitigate the pollution effects of urbanization on stormwater runoff.

Throughout each year, the stormwater management program for Minneapolis is developed and modified with input from a variety of sources. Examples include technology and policy changes, regulatory requirements, collaboration with watershed management organizations, environmental groups and other water quality professionals, lessons learned from our projects, input from the Environmental Coordinating Team (ECT), concerns raised by residents and others, and responses to our website information.

Requirements for Annual Reporting, Public Comment, and Council Action

The Permit requires that the City prepare and submit an Annual Report that includes two components: the Permit activities for the previous year, and the stormwater management program for current and future years. This Annual Report must be submitted by June 1 of each calendar year. The Permit also requires that opportunities be made for the general public to provide comments regarding the draft Annual Report. The comments must be solicited and received prior to the Annual Report submittal to the MPCA. The cutoff date for written comments by the general public regarding this year's draft Annual Report is Noon on Friday, May 9, 2008.

A notice to the parties listed on the Attachment was sent on April 23, 2008, indicating that the draft Annual Report is available for viewing on the following City website:
