The Police Department respectfully requests permission to accept the U.S Office of Community Oriented Policing Services grant award on behalf of the Business Information Systems department to support the city's Criminal Justice Information Integration initiative. We also request that the proper city officials be authorized to execute the required contract agreements. We also request an amendment to the general appropriation resolution for 2004 in the amount of \$650,000. The grant award will operate through the Business Information Systems Federal Grant Special Revenue Fund, 0300-972-9725, Revenue Source 3210.

Background/Supporting Information

The Police Department requests permission to accept the U.S Office of Community Oriented Policing Services grant award on behalf of the Business Information Systems department. This grant award comes to the city through the Police Department but will operate within BIS.

BIS will manage the development, implementation an integration of the Criminal Justice Information Integration system as summarized below.

Criminal Justice Information Integration Initiative

The City Attorney's Office is implementing an advanced, comprehensive case management system (CMS) for both its Criminal and Civil Divisions. It is the vision of the City Attorney's Office to have a system that pro-actively gathers information, collaboratively shares information with other agencies, stores content related to cases or other matters and provides the staff with the means to manage case loads more effectively.

The Criminal Justice Information Integration Initiative will provide the City Attorney's Office with a system with which to obtain and share information with partnering agencies to support the prosecution of criminal cases. The primary focus of CJII will be to Integrate the City Attorney's Case Management System with inter-jurisdictional criminal justice systems including: Courts, Police, Sheriff, Violations Bureau, MECC, County Attorney, Community Corrections, State Driver & Vehicle Services, the state Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, CrimNet and national systems, as applicable. CJII will provide timely and accurate information to the Case Management System electronically, eliminating redundant manual data entry processes.
