Recommendation:

- A. Passage of a resolution ordering the City Engineer to proceed and do the work and adopting special assessments in the amount of \$19,261.57 for the Butler PI Project No 5221 Street Resurfacing Project and special assessments in the amount of \$49,456.67 for the 9th St S Project No 5222 Street Resurfacing Project.
- B. Passage of a Resolution requesting the Board of Estimate and Taxation to issue and sell assessment bonds in the amount of \$19,265 for the Butler PI Street Resurfacing Project No 5221 and in the amount of \$49,460 for the 9th St S Project No 5222, with the bonds to be paid for from special assessments.

Background/Supporting Information:

On April 1, 2011, the City Council designated the location, streets and improvements proposed to be made in the Butler PI and 9th St S areas. The cost estimate for Butler PI is \$65,880 and \$178,920 for 9th St S. The funding sources for this project are assessments and Infrastructure Acceleration Program dollars.

The locations of the street resurfacing projects are Butler Place and 9th St S. Butler PI is from 24th Av S to 25th Av S and from Riverside to 25th Av S. 9th St S is from 20th Av S to 25th Ave S and from Riverside Ave to 25th Ave S. Butler PI and 9th St S are local city streets.

The street resurfacing would be a mill and overlay of the street surface with plant mix asphalt and other paving related improvements as needed. These paving projects are scheduled for summer or fall of 2011 and will be constructed by the City's workforce.

The street resurfacing special assessments were determined by applying the 2011 Uniform Assessment Rates to the land area of benefited parcels located within the street influence zone along the improved streets. The 2011 resurfacing assessment rates are:

\$0.52 /sq ft – Non-Residential


\$0.20 /sq ft – Residential

The proposed total assessment amount for the Butler PI project is \$19,261.57. The proposed total assessment amount for the 9th St S project is \$49,456.67. Individual assessments of more than \$150 would be collected over 5 years beginning on the 2012 real estate tax statements with interest charged at the same rate as the City pays in interest for selling assessment bonds. Assessments of \$150 or less would be collected in their entirety on the 2012 real estate tax statements with interest charged at the same rate as the City pays in interest for selling assessment bonds. Information has been provided in the Notices as to how persons may prepay the special assessments in full without interest if they so choose.

City Council has passed resolutions whereby a deferment of a special assessment may be obtained by showing hardship for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older or retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability.

Whereas, public hearings were held on May 17, 2011 in accordance with Chapter 10, Section 8 of the Minneapolis City Charter and Section 24.180 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances to consider the proposed improvements as designated in Resolution 2011R-140, passed April 1, 2011 to consider the proposed special assessments as on file in the office of the City Clerk and to consider all written and oral objections and statements regarding the proposed improvements and the proposed special assessments;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Minneapolis:

That the City Engineer is hereby ordered to proceed and do the work as designated in said Resolution 2011R-140, passed April 1, 2011.

Be It Further Resolved that the proposed special assessments in the total amount of \$19,261.57 for the Butler PI Street Resurfacing Project and in the total amount of \$49,456.67 for the

9th St S Street Resurfacing Project as on file in the office of the City Clerk, be and hereby are adopted and assessed against the benefited properties.

Be It Further Resolved that the number of successive equal annual principal installments by which the special assessments of more than \$150 may be paid shall be fixed at five (5) and that the interest be charged at the same rate as the City pays in interest for selling assessment bonds with collection of the special assessments to begin on the 2012 real estate tax statements.

Be It Further Resolved that the number of installments by which the special assessments of \$150 or less may be paid shall be fixed at one (1) and that interest be charged at the same rate as the City pays in interest for selling assessment bonds with collection of the special assessments to begin on the 2012 real estate tax statements.
