



## Request for City Council Committee Action from the Minneapolis Police Department

**Date:** February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011

**To:** PSH Committee

**Cc:** Full City Council

**Subject:** Transfer (donation) of outdated Minneapolis Police Department's Law Enforcement Equipment to another Law Enforcement agency

**Recommendation:** The Pine County Sheriffs Office has requested 25 Remington model 870 Police Shotguns to become a permanent part of the Pine County sheriffs inventory to be converted for less lethal firearm for use in their Detention Facility. These shotguns were formally used by the Minneapolis Police Department as our street shotgun but have recently been replaced with a more modern weapon system. The Minneapolis Police have no further use for these guns and were planning on having them destroyed at a cost of three FTE staff days. Approving this request would not only save the MPD staff time but would also allow another Minnesota law enforcement agency to use these weapons to fulfill their mission.
