Recommendation:

Council authorization for the proper City officials to:

1. amend contract #27693 with Hennepin Count to accept an additional \$65,000 for a new contract total of \$565,000 for lead poisoning prevention services, and increase both the revenue estimate in fund/department 01300-8600130 (revenue code 321008) and the 2011 appropriation in fund/department 01300-8600130 by \$65,000.
2. amend contracts with the following community partner agencies for Lead Poisoning Prevention Services from fund/org 01300-8600130 for a new termination date of August 31, 2012, and for new contract totals not to exceed:

ClearCorps USA, Inc., Contract #27843	\$170,000
Southeast Asian Community Council, Inc., Contract #27826	\$ 70,000
