**Background/Supporting Information Attached. The special legislation clarifies that the city of Minneapolis and the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) can require that new housing developers dedicate land for or pay a fee for public parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, wetlands or open space provided**

**the provisions of general law are followed. For example the dedication must have a nexus, be proportionate and fair and reasonable. The city and the MPRB must adopt an ordinance jointly to impose the dedication of land or the fee.**

**Local approval as required by Minnesota Statutes section 645.021 require approval by the city council and filing of the resolution and required certificate with the Secretary of State. The local approval action does not approve the fee or land dedication. Separate council actions will be needed to implement the special law.**

**Approving Laws of Minnesota 2006, Chapter 269, Section 2.**

Whereas, the Minnesota State Legislature has passed a law relating to dedication land or fees for parks and open space purposes; and

Whereas, said law, by its terms, requires an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council before it may become effective;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by The City Council of The City of Minneapolis:

That said law be now approved and the City Clerk be directed to prepare and file with the Secretary of State the required certification of approval.
