Amending Title 14, Chapter 364 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances relating to Liquor and Beer: Liquor Regulations.

The City Council of The City of Minneapolis do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 364.30 of the above-entitled ordinance be and is hereby repealed.

~~**364.30. Sales to incompetents or drunkards.** No licensee, his or her agent or employee, shall knowingly sell, serve or dispense any liquor to any habitual drunkard or person under guardianship, nor after written notice by a parent, husband, wife, child, guardian, master or employer of such habitual drunkard or person under guardianship, nor to any habitual drunkard after written notice by the mayor or the chief of police of the municipality in which such habitual drunkard resides, within one year after such notice in case of an habitual drunkard, and in other cases during the continuance of the guardianship of such persons.~~

Section 2. That the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances be amended by adding thereto a new Section 364.30 to read as follows:

364.30. Sales to obviously intoxicated persons. No person may sell, give, furnish, or in any way procure for another alcoholic beverages for the use of an obviously intoxicated person.

Section 3. That Section 364.120 of the above-entitled ordinance be and is hereby repealed.

~~**364.120. Blood alcohol chart required.** (a) All "off sale" liquor establishments shall post, in a conspicuous place, a sign, measuring not less than one foot by two (2) feet, which contains a chart illustrating the estimated amount of eighty (80) proof alcohol needed to reach approximate given levels of alcohol in the blood and in addition shall contain the following:~~

~~It is unlawful to drive a motor vehicle while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage or when your blood alcohol content contains 0.10 percent or more by weight of alcohol. Conviction may result in a fine of up to seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) or imprisonment of up to ninety (90) days, or both.~~

~~(b) The department of licenses and consumer services shall design such sign and, after approval by the city council, shall make it available to all licensed "off sale" liquor establishments.~~
