**Background/Supporting Information Attached:**

The Metropolitan Emergency Services Board (MESB) was formed as the combination of the Metropolitan Radio Board and Metropolitan 911 Board in 2005. The new organization includes a "seat" on the Board for a Minneapolis elected official. The Board recently approved the addition of a "seat" on the Technical Operations Committee (TOC) for E-911 to advise them. Previously, the TOC was attended by Minneapolis personnel, but were counted, for voting purposes, as Hennepin County representatives. Now, Hennepin County retains seats, and a Minneapolis seat was officially added. The by-laws call for designating both a primary and alternate member. John Dejung is the 911 Director and Tom Donohoe is the Assistant Director for 911.
