**Subject:** AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND CONTRACT #26407 WITH HENNEPIN COUNTY TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR LATINO STUDENTS THE SCHOOL BASED CLINIC PROGRAM

**Recommendation:**

Council authorization for the proper City officials to:

1. amend contract #26407 with Hennepin County to accept additional revenue of \$9,000 in Local Collaborative Time Study funds for mental health services at the School Based Clinics for a new contract total of \$90,000, and
2. increase both the revenue budget in fund/dept 01600-8600152 (revenue code 322002) and the 2008 appropriation in fund/dept 01600-8600152 by the additional \$9,000.

**Background/Supporting Information Attached**

The Department's School Based Clinic program was previously awarded \$81,000 from the Children's Mental Health Collaborative of Hennepin County for a three year project to provide mental health services to Latino students served through the School Based Clinic program. Initially an additional \$9,000 was set aside by the County for project evaluation through another agency. In order for the City to adhere to HIPAA data privacy requirements, the County subsequently approved a revision to the project evaluation plan and the additional funding is being provided to the City to perform the evaluation.
