**Approve and authorize revenues from the Cardiac Science agreement in an estimated amount of \$60,000 in year 2007, and increase the Fire Department appropriation to Fund 0100 Agency 280 Organization 2820 Object 4000 in the estimated amount of \$60,000. Approve a Revenue Source increase of \$60,000 to Fund 0100 Agency 280 Organization 2820 Revenue Source 3755-04. The \$60,000 in revenues will approximately cover the cost of one Firefighter FTE.**

**Initially beginning in 2004, the City established the Minneapolis Project Heartbeat program to make the City of Minneapolis "Heart Safe" to save lives through early defibrillation; and approved an agreement between the City and Cardiac Science to allow Cardiac Science to assist the City in its promotion of the Project Heartbeat Program and to pay the City marketing support payments and fees to the City in exchange for access to the commercial marketing potential associated with the City.**
