Public Hearing Requirement: A public hearing is required for this license application. 69 notices were mailed to residents and property owners within 300 feet of the premises, and emailed to the East Isles Residents Association and the Lowry Hill East Neighborhood Association on August 1, 2011. The public hearing will be held on August 22, 2011 at the Regulatory, Energy and Environment Committee meeting. As of August 15, 2011, there has been one written response received for this application. It is in support of the application.

Background: The applicant proposes to extend the hours of operation for their food manufacturer with delivery service provided by on-site employees from 10:00am to 3:00 am daily.

Findings as Required by the Minneapolis Licensing Code:

The Licenses and Consumer Services Division has analyzed the application and concludes that the application has answered the following:

A security plan that describes the security features, including personnel and equipment, that the applicant will employ and how they will be utilized:

The licensee shall compile, maintain and enforce a "do not admit" list to prevent reoccurrence of disturbances by known persons. This list shall be shared with Minneapolis Regulatory Services and the Minneapolis Police Department upon request. Upon request, the licensee shall meet representatives of the City of Minneapolis to discuss any safety, security or operational concerns. Also, see Domino's corporate security policy.

Description of how the applicant will maintain the orderly appearance and operation of the premises with respect to litter and noise:

Staff will remove litter once daily. The establishment will not tolerate loud employees (in regards to their vehicles or the music from said vehicles) or loud customers.

Description of how the business will have people exit the establishment at closing time and during an emergency that requires all people to exit the establishment quickly:

Because this is a delivery institution, closing time exit is not applicable.

Such other reasonable and pertinent information as the city council may require:

Upon request, the licensee shall meet representatives of the City of Minneapolis to discuss any safety, security or operational concerns.

Proximity to permitted or conditional residential uses.

Nature of the business and its impacts of noise, light and traffic.

The establishment borders a residential area.

Conformance with applicable zoning regulations, including but not limited to use, yards, gross floor area and specific development standards.

The existing business is categorized as a food manufacturer which is a permitted use in the C1 district.

History of complaints related to the use.

There are no significant police calls for service at this location. Licenses and Consumer Services records show that there have been no violations related to operating outside the allowed hours of operation. Licenses and Consumer Services has not received complaints regarding noise or unruly customer issues.

RECOMMENDATIONS (pending public hearing):

The Licenses and Consumer Services Division make the following recommendation regarding this application to extend hours:

A recommendation for this license application will be made after the public hearing is held on August 22, 2011.

Considerations include:

- There is a residential district directly behind this establishment.
- The business is located in an area that is very concerned about late night establishments operating in their area.
