## Request for City Council Committee Action From the Department of Public Works



**Subject:** Accepting a \$15,000 US Department of Interior Grant from the National Parks Service, Mississippi National River and Recreation Area (MNRRA).

**Background/Supporting Information Attached**

The Minneapolis Public Works Department is asking to accept a \$15,000 US Department of Interior Grant from the National Parks Service Mississippi National River and Recreation Area (MNRRA) for native plantings (prairie grass and native wild flowers) along the 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE project. (Between University Avenue SE and Main Street SE). Field Services of the Public Works Department substantially completed construction of this project in the summer of 2001. It is anticipated that the native plantings will be completed by separate contractor in mid-June.

The plantings are part of a larger project that is being done in cooperation with the Marcy Holmes Neighborhood NRP program and the City of Minneapolis Department of Public Works. The native plantings will comply with the current city planting ordinances and will be maintained by the neighborhood per a letter of understanding between Public Works and the Marcy Homes Neighborhood NRP program.
