



Request for City Council Committee Action From the Police Department

Subject

On September 13, 2002 the City Council authorized the Minneapolis Police Department to enter into a Joint Powers Agreement with State of Minnesota to license certain rights related to the APS Automated Pawn System to the State, and provide for statewide rollout and support of the APS Automated Pawn System by the City of Minneapolis. Final approval of the agreement was delayed at the State due to a reassignment of the project under the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, Criminal Justice Information Systems. That delay resulted in the stale-dating of certain aspects of the original agreement including its effective date.

Therefore, the Minneapolis Police Department is again requesting permission to enter into a Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota to license certain rights related to the APS Automated Pawn System to the State, and providing for statewide rollout and support of the APS Automated Pawn System by the City of Minneapolis. The new agreement is unchanged from the original except as noted in the attached summary.

Recommendation

Permission to enter in a Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota approved by the City Attorney, whereas the State will enhance, administer and direct all aspects of the APS Automated Pawn System and the City will provide statewide rollout and support. For the right to access, modify and enhance the APS Automated Pawn System source code and schema, integrate APS in to CriMNet, manage and administer the APS Automated Pawn System and market it to other political sub-divisions, the City will receive a one time fee of up to \$490,000.00. The agreement will further provide for the City to be reimbursed by the State for all documented rollout and support related expenses up to \$38,000.00 monthly. Funds from this agreement will be payable to Fund 2100 400 C201, Revenue Code 3755

Previous Directives

September 13, 2002 Council approved (13-0) Automated Pawn System: Execute Joint Powers Agreement with the State where State will enhance, administer and direct all aspects of the System and City will provide statewide rollout and support.

April 14, 2001. Council approved (13-0) participation by the APS Automated Pawn System in the Minnesota Department of Administration, InterTechnologies Group, Database Test Bed Integration Project to explore, test and develop ways in which disparate criminal justice databases may be accessed through a single user logon using a browser-based interface. (CriMNet)

May 18, 2001 Council authorized (12-0) staff to negotiate and implement APS Automated Pawn System licensing and support agreements with political subdivisions, outside Minnesota, and other potential strategic partners. Council further authorized City Attorney to identify and provide required legal services and support of said negotiations, including drafting, reviewing and final concurrence of the agreements.
