**AN ORDINANCE

**Amending Title 11, Chapter 223 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances relating to Health and Sanitation: Drugs.**

The City Council of the City of Minneapolis do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 223.170 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances be amended by adding thereto a new subdivision (d) to read as follows:

**223.170. Sale or transfer to persons seventeen years and under.** (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) hereof and section 223.180, no person seventeen (17) years of age or under shall possess or buy any glue, spray paint, inhalant, or room odorizer, containing the intoxicating substances defined in 223.150, and no person shall sell or transfer possession of any glue, spray paint, inhalant or room odorizer, containing the intoxicating substances defined in section 223.150 to another person seventeen (17) years of age or under.

(b) Provided, however, a person may sell or transfer possession of any glue or spray paint containing the intoxicating substances defined in section 223.150 to a person seventeen (17) years of age or under for model building or other lawful use where said juvenile has in possession and presents the written consent of the juvenile's parent or guardian, which consent shall contain the address and telephone number of said parent or guardian.

(c) This section shall not apply where the spray paint, glue or cement is sold, delivered, or given away simultaneously with and as part of a kit used for the construction of model airplanes, model boats, model automobiles, model trains, or other similar models.

(d) Display and storage of aerosol paint containers.

(1) Every person who owns, conducts, operates, or manages a retail commercial establishment selling aerosol spray paint shall store the aerosol containers behind a counter in an area viewable by the public but not accessible to the public.

(2) In the event that a commercial retail establishment does not store the aerosol containers as provided above, the establishment shall store the aerosol spray paint containers in a locked cabinet not accessible to the public without employee assistance.

- (3) Nothing herein shall preclude a retail commercial establishment from storing the aerosol spray paint containers in a back or storage room not accessible to the public without employee assistance.
- (4) Establishments must display at or near the aerosol spray paint display, in clear public view, a sign stating: "We ID. No Spray Paint Sales to Minors" and the language of Minneapolis ordinance 223.150.
