STEP-UP Program Seeks Minneapolis Youth for 2011 Summer Jobs



It is not too early for teens to start planning for a summer job. The City of Minneapolis STEP-UP Program is now accepting applications from youth ages 14-21. STEP-UP trains and places Minneapolis youth in paid internships during the summer at local businesses. Youth earn a minimum of \$7.25 to upwards of \$10 an hour. Most interns work part-time for up to 9 weeks during the summer. Youth selected to participate in the STEP-UP program must attend the mandatory work readiness training in April to be considered for a summer position.

2011 summer job applications will be accepted through Feb. 4, 2011.

Camden Neighborhood Photos Now in Library Database



Hennepin County Library Special Collections has added 256 19th-century photos of the Camden neighborhood to the Minneapolis Collection photo database. These photos depict businesses, homes, churches, parks and residents. Graduate student volunteers helped with entering descriptions of the photos into a database intermittently over the course of almost two years. Glenn Peterson, Information & Online Services, was also instrumental in providing IT support. The photos fill a geographical gap in the collection, which until now has focused more extensively on downtown and south Minneapolis.
