This is a supplement by Lt. R.K. Thomas badge 7182 on 3/15/06 at approx. 1956 hrs.

I am currently the commander of the Third Precinct Community response Team (CRT). On this date, CRT Off. Christie Nelson advised me that she wanted to execute a narcotics search warrant for 1839 E. 26th St. I was aware of the pending warrant on 3/14/06 and performed a recon of the address on that date. This address is an upper/lower duplex with the upper unit being 1841 E. 26th St. This was a complaint address that had caused considerable public concern of the drug dealing taking place at the address.

A pre-warrant briefing was conducted at the CRT office at approx. 1500 hrs. During the briefing, Off. Nelson informed the group of her intelligence information. I then made the following entry and perimeter assignments. Myself as team leader, Sgt. T. Peterson with the fire extinguisher, Off. Nimlos with the body bunker, Offs. Menter and Merten with the ram, Off. Lehner with the hooligan, and Off. Nelson trailing. Uniform Offs. Blade and Friestleben would be rear perimeter.

~~We proceeded to the target address and approached the front door. The front was clearly marked. I knocked on the front door several times and announced it was the police and our purpose for being there. After receiving no response at the door, Offs. Menter and Merten rammed the door open. Myself and Nimlos proceeded inside with the rest of the team trailing. I observed a native female later ID as MARY CROSS in the kitchen with 2 small children. Also by her was a W/M party later ID as ROBERT MATHISON. In the rear bedroom was a native male later ID as TIMOTHY ADAMS. All of the adults had been ordered to the ground at gunpoint. The two male adults were handcuffed and CROSS was allowed to handle her children.~~

Once we had a CODE4 situation, I responded to my car and returned with a notebook for biographical interviews. All of the parties were allowed to sit down when submitting to biographical interviews. All three parties cooperated. CROSS advised me that she is on welfare and has been residing at the address for approx. a month and one half. ADAMS advised me he has been residing at the address with CROSS. ADAMS advised that he has recently come down to the cities from the Leech Lake Reservation.

CROSS advised me that her 2 children are KUELAUNNIE 2 yrs. and AVIRIAN 10 months.

MATHISON advised me that he is the resident caretaker and lives in the second floor of the address which is 1541 E. 26th St. MATHISON advised me that the owner of the property is ANGEL BRODIN and lives in Buffalo MN.

I ran warrant checks on the three adults and channel 7 advised me that they were all clear warrants. Sgt. Peterson and the rest of the CRT Offs. conducted the on-scene searches and interrogations. See their reports for further.

Sgt. Peterson informed me that CROSS would be allowed to stay at the address with her 2 children. No arrests made at this time. We secured the scene.

On 03-15-2006, I was assigned to the 3rd Precinct Community Response Team. Officer Nelson conducted an investigation and obtained a daytime/ knock and announce narcotics search warrant for the residence 1539 26th Street East, Minneapolis. The 3rd Precinct CRT Team had received citizen complaints of suspected narcotics activity involving this residence.

On this date, Officer Nelson and I informed Lieutenant Thomas of the search warrant and made arrangements to serve the warrant. Prior to executing the warrant, Officer Nelson and Lieutenant Thomas conducted a briefing with assisting Officers Lehner, Menter, Merten, and Nimlos. The briefing held at the 3rd precinct station.

During the briefing, Officer Nelson informed assisting Officers of her investigative finds. Lieutenant Thomas assigned Officers to the Entry Team and perimeter duties. I was assigned to the Entry Team as a cover Officer and brought a fire extinguisher for canine purposes. Uniformed Officers Blade and Fiestleben, manned squad 322, were assigned to cover the perimeter.

Concluding our briefing, we proceeded to the address to serve the warrant. Enroute to the location, I notified the dispatch supervisor and advised them of the warrant location and units involved. Upon arrival, we approached from the South and proceeded to the front door. Officers knocked loudly and announced "Police!, Search warrant!" No response was received from within the residence.

Receiving no response, the signal was given and forced entry was affected to gain entrance into the residence. The door was struck with the ram tool numerous times before the inner door frame and lock mechanism gave way and the door swung open. Officers found the inner door unlocked and entered the residence. During entry Officers and I announced ourselves as "Police" followed by our lawful purpose search warrant.

Upon entering the residence, I observed an adult male/Robert Michael Mathison and an adult female/ Mary Ann Cross and two children/ in the kitchen. In proceeding into the residence, I observed a pit bull terrier crouched with ear back exit the kitchen and advanced toward Officers.

I directed a quick burst from the fire extinguisher at the canine. The canine responded by diverting his path towards Officers and ran out the breached front door of the residence. I later attempted to locate the canine with negative results. The tenants said the canine, named "Blaze" belonged to an acquaintance.

Officer cleared the residence and found a second adult male/ Timothy John Adams in the Southeast bedroom. Officers found no other persons within the residence.

After the scene was secure, a systematic search of the residence was conducted within the scope of the warrant. Officers recovered packaging materials and drug paraphernalia.

Officer Nelson left a copy of the search warrant and page 5 that listed the collected evidence with the resident/ Mary Ann Cross. Resident/ Cross assumed responsibility for securing the front exterior residence door. It should be noted, Robert Michael Mathison is the onsite caretaker of the property and upstairs resident.

I followed officers through this door, and another unsecured door, leading into the family room. I assisted in clearing the room for suspects and observed an adult female and two adult males inside.

I assisted in a search of the dwelling, which was dirty and unkept.

On 03-15-2006 I was assigned to the 3rd PCT CRT unit investigating narcotics activity in and related to the city of Minneapolis. I was contacted by Officer Nelson and requested to assist with a search warrant at 1539 26th St E, Mpls. I was requested to attend a pre-search warrant briefing at the 3rd PCT CRT office at 1455 hours. Officer Nelson held a briefing at the 3rd PCT CRT unit with officers involved with the detail. Officer Nelson gave officers information related to the investigation, including information on the suspect/sellers, location of the house, the fact that there were possibly two dogs in the house, two small children in the house, and that it was a daytime, knock and announce warrant. I was assigned to the entry team on the ram with Officer Merten. I was wearing plain clothes and a ballistic raid vest that had the word "Police" clearly displayed on the front and rear of the vest.

After arriving at the above location officers went to the front door and Lt Thomas pounded on the door several times announcing our presence and purpose. After getting no response Lt Thomas ordered that the door be forced open. Officer Merten and I struck the door several times and officers made entry. We located AP/Cross in the kitchen with her two small children. ~~OT/Mathison was also located in the kitchen. They were both ordered to the floor at gunpoint.~~ I stayed with Cross and Mathison while entry officers cleared the rest of the unit.

I searched the dining room area and the livingroom area. Officer Lehner and I cleared the scene early so we could go work street patrol duties.

On the above date and time, I was working as a member of the 3rd Precinct Community Response Team (CRT). I was asked by Officer Nelson to assist with a search warrant at 1539 26th street east (the lower level of an up down duplex). Officer Nelson stated the location of the search warrant, the person listed in the search warrant, the items to be seized, and that it was a daytime knock and announce search warrant. I was then assigned to the Hooligan tool as a member of the entry team.

Upon arrival at the above location the entry officers arrived to the south of the unit. The entry team then approached the front of the address and Lt. Thomas knocked and announced our presence at the front door by stating "Police, Search Warrant" over and over again.

~~After a brief period of time with no answer at the front door Officer Menter and Merten forced open the front door. The entry officers then entered the lower unit and encountered several people inside the lower unit. All of these individuals were secured and the lower unit was made code four.~~

After the scene was code four I was asked by Officer Nelson to assist with a systematic search of the address for the items listed in the search warrant. While searching the kitchen I located an amount of packaging material and a plate that appeared to have cocaine residue on it. These items were turned over to Officer Nelson.

After the search of the residence was finished I cleared the scene.

A search warrant was executed at 1539 26th St E lower unit, Minneapolis, MN on the afternoon of 3-15-2006 resulting from an on-going narcotics investigation.

While I was assigned to the Third Precinct Community Response Team, I received information from several concerned citizens (CC) herein that narcotics are being sold out of 1539 26th St E, lower unit. The CCs stated that there was a large volume of vehicle and pedestrian traffic coming and going from this address where the parties would arrive and leave after a short period of time. Through training and experience, this activity is consistent with narcotics activity.

~~I conducted surveillance on this address and observed several individuals arrive at this address and enter through the front door to 1539 26th St E and a common back door. These parties would leave after a short while. This structure is an up/down duplex. The upper unit has the house number of 1541 26th St E and the lower unit has the house number of 1539 26th St E.~~

I received information from a Confidential Reliable Informant (CRI) that narcotics were being sold from within 1539 26th St E, lower unit. I directed the CRI to attempt to make a controlled purchase of narcotics (cocaine) from within 1539 East 26th St, lower. The CRI was given \$20.00 in pre-recorded buy money to make the controlled purchase of narcotics. I observed the CRI approach the front of the address and the CRI was let inside the lower unit. The CRI entered into the lower unit and returned to me at a predetermined location a short while later. I watched the CRI exit out of the front door. The CRI presented to me an amount of suspected narcotics. I took immediate control of the control buy from the CRI.

The CRI described the seller as a black male, approximately 6'2" tall, thin build, medium to dark complexion, approximately 22-24 years old, who goes by the name of "Naughty." The CRI also stated that there was a Native American male, 6'2" tall, with a heavy build, chin length straight black hair, that was 26-28 years old.

I conducted a field test on the suspected narcotics and it field tested positive for cocaine and weighed .1 gram with packaging.

Within seventy-two hours of the controlled buy being conducted, I drew up a narcotics search warrant and presented it to the Honorable Judge Belois for review and signed on 2-24-2006.

Officers were unable to execute this search warrant in the allotted amount of time.

I continued to conduct surveillance on this address. There continued to be heavy amounts of foot and vehicle traffic to the lower unit. During surveillance, I also observed two pitbull type of dogs. There was a white colored one and a brown colored one that appeared to be a puppy.

I directed another CRI to this address to conduct a controlled purchase of narcotics. The CRI was observed going into the front door and entering inside of the lower unit. The CRI was given pre-recorded buy funds to attempt to purchase narcotics from inside of 1539 26th Street E, lower unit. The CRI returned to a pre-determined location. The CRI stated that the front door was open and the CRI was able to walk into the lower unit. When the CRI returned to the predetermined location a short while later, the CRI described the seller as a Native American male, 5'5" tall with a heavy build, approximately 19-24 years old as the person who sold the CRI a quantity of suspected cocaine for the pre-recorded buy money.

The quantity of suspected cocaine weighed .2 grams with packaging and field tested positive for cocaine.

Within seventy-two hours of the controlled purchase of cocaine, I drew up an updated search warrant and presented it to the Honorable Judge Belois for review and signed on 3-9-2006.

On 3-15-2006 at approximately 1516 hours, officers from the Third Precinct CRT executed a search warrant at 1539 26th Street E, lower unit. Prior to the execution of the search warrant, I held a briefing at the Third Precinct Station. Sgt. Peterson had requested squad 322 to assist with a uniform presence in the perimeter. During the briefing, I advised CRT officers that this was a daytime, knock-and-announce narcotics search warrant. The suspects were described as a Native American male, 5'5" tall, with a heavy build, approximately 19-24 years old. I also advised that there were kids and two pitbulls that were observed at the lower address. The route of travel to the address was determined.

Upon arrival, officers approached the house from the east side of the house. At the front door, officers knocked at the door and announced our presence and authority by stating several times, "Police! Search Warrant!" The ram team was able to breach open the front door and gain entry into the doorway. As officers were inside, a brown colored pitbull dog was running towards officers. I observed Sgt. Peterson administer a burst of the fire extinguisher towards it to keep it from attacking officers. During the entry, officers encountered a female, later ID'd as A1/CROSS in the kitchen with two small children. There were also two males inside the lower unit when the search warrant was executed. Ot1/ADAMS was in the back bedroom and OT2/MATHISON was in the back hallway near the kitchen. Once the scene was Code 4, I was advised that the brown pitbull had ran out of the open front door.

Once the scene was Code 4, I instructed CRT officers to conduct a systematic search of the lower unit. I began interviewing the parties that were inside the lower unit.

I spoke with A1/CROSS who stated that she lived in the lower unit, but she was looking for a new place to live. The two small children were hers. She stated that "Duane" is the father to both of the kids. She also stated that her boyfriend is Emerjirido Duane Carmona 2-1-86, who goes by the name of "Duane." She also stated that the brown pitbull was a puppy that did not belong to her. She said that she was trying to sell it for some money. She stated that the white pitbull was gone.

I spoke with OT1/ADAMS who stated that he was staying at 1539 26th Street E, lower unit with his cousin MARY (A1). He said that he had recently moved to Mpls.

I was advised by OFFICER LEHNER that he had found some packaging materials in the kitchen. These materials are consistent with how crack cocaine is packaged and sold on the street. OFFICER LEHNER also informed me that he observed a plate in the kitchen with white powdery residue on it. I recovered these items.

A photo of a man's face was also recovered. On the bottom of the photo it stated, "Duane." CROSS stated that this was her boyfriend "Duane."

OFFICER NIMLOS took a Scales statement from Cross. See OFFICER NIMLOS' report for further details.

The older child, Kvelaunnie (V1) was two years old and the younger sibling (V2) was 10 months old. The house appeared to be dirty. The floors were filthy. V1 was dirty and needed a change of clothes. CROSS stated that she was in the process of moving. I observed that there was plenty of food in the fridge and the cupboards.

Sgt. PETERSON advised me that he checked the neighborhood and the brown pitbull was nowhere to be seen.

On the above date and time, officers from Third Precinct Community Response Team executed a search warrant at 1539 26th Street East, Minneapolis, MN. Prior to the warrant, I was tasked to assist Officer Nelson on a search warrant for a lower unit of an up/down duplex for narcotics. Officer Nelson made arrangements for a briefing to be held at the Third Precinct CRT office.

During the briefing, Officer Nelson informed officers she has a daytime announced search warrant for narcotics that is a complaint address from the neighborhood. Officer Nelson informed us that the suspect was described as a Native American male, 5'5" tall, with a heavy build, approximately 19-24 years old. During the assignment, I was assigned to the entry team on the bunker tool followed Lt. Thomas and the remaining CRT team. Officers Blade and Frestleben were assigned to cover the perimeter.

After the briefing, officers traveled the pre-determined route and arrived to the south of the address before we approached the front door on foot. Once at the front door, Lt. Thomas knocked and announced our presence stating "police search warrant" several times and found the lower door was locked. After waiting a short period of time, Officers Menter and Merten breached opened the door and I entered the dwelling with the bunker tool announcing our presence stating "Police, search warrant" numerous times.

Once inside the dwelling, I observed a female in the dining room with two kids who were secured along with a male identified as TIMOTHY ADAMS secured by trailing officers. I continued through the dwelling and located a male in the southeast bedroom on the lower level who officers secured while I continued to search throughout the dwelling.

During the search, I assisted with the southeast bedroom and was requested by Officer Nelson to conduct a Miranda interview on AP1/CROSS who agreed to speak with me after reading the Miranda Warning. I learned that she lives here with her two kids and boyfriend who just left prior to our arrival. AP1/Cross admitted allowing a seller who goes by "Naughty" to sell narcotics out of her place.

After the scene was processed, officers cleared the scene
