
Subject: Extend contract with Restorative Justice Community Action, Inc. to January 31, 2009.

Community Impact

Background/Supporting Information

The Minneapolis City Attorney's Office has contracted for one and a half years with the Restorative Justice Community Action, Inc. to provide restorative justice services. The current contract expires December 31, 2009.

The City Attorney's Office received City Council approval on November 7, 2008 to initiate a Request for Proposal (RFP) process to continue these services. Responses to the RFP will not be evaluated in enough time to make a decision before December 31st. So that restorative justice services are not interrupted, the Office is requesting that the current contract's period of performance be extended an additional one month. All other terms of the current contract would remain unchanged, including the current service level and the current compensation for those services.
