Subject: Minneapolis Schools "Second 7.5%" NRP Funds Request

Summary of the Request: Minneapolis Schools, working in partnership with the effected neighborhoods, request the use of remaining "Second 7.5%" NRP Funds for computer lab updates at six schools. The neighborhoods have revised their action plans accordingly and the NRP Policy Board has approved the request. City Council action is needed to increase the NRP Program Fund CNR0 to fund this request.

Recommendation:

(1) Approve the use of \$459,130 of Minneapolis Schools "Second 7.5%" NRP funds to support Internet Lab upgrades in the following schools:

\$80,478 to Anthony Middle School in the Kenny neighborhood,
\$152,004 to Edison High School in the Holland neighborhood,
\$28,960 to Ericsson Community School in the Standish Ericsson neighborhood,
\$46,522 to Shingle Creek Community School in the Shingle Creek neighborhood,
\$103,706 to Sullivan Community School in the Longfellow neighborhood, and
\$47,460 to Wenonah Community School in the Nokomis East neighborhood.

- (2) Amend the 2004 City of Minneapolis General Operating Resolution by increasing the NRP Program Fund CNR0 by \$459,130;
- (3) Authorize the appropriate City officers to enter into any contracts or agreements needed to implement this request.

Re: Minneapolis Schools "Second 7.5%" for School Projects

Dear Chairpersons Goodman and Johnson:

At its meeting on March 22, 2004 the Neighborhood Revitalization Policy Board approved the use of up to \$459,130 of Minneapolis Schools "Second 7.5%" NRP funds for Internet lab update projects in six schools.

The Minneapolis Schools have been working in partnership with neighborhoods since the beginning of NRP. We are now coming to the end of "Second 7.5%" NRP Funds for the Minneapolis Schools. With the cooperation of the following neighborhoods, the Minneapolis Schools will invest \$459,130 into the following schools for Internet labs.

Neighborhood	School	Amount
Kenny	Anthony Middle School	80,478
Holland	Edison High School	152,004
Standish Ericsson	Ericsson Community School	28,960
Shingle Creek	Shingle Creek Community School	46,522
Longfellow	Sullivan Community School	103,706
Nokomis East	Wenonah Community School	47,460

Each neighborhood has approved the request of the Minneapolis Schools and is modifying its Action Plan accordingly.

RESOLVED: That the Minneapolis Neighborhood Revitalization Policy Board hereby approves the use of up to \$459,130 of Minneapolis Schools "Second 7.5%" NRP Funds to support Internet Lab upgrades as follows:

- 1) \$80,478 to Anthony Middle School in the Kenny neighborhood,
- 2) \$152,004 to Edison High School in the Holland neighborhood,
- 3) \$28,960 to Ericsson Community School in the Standish Ericsson neighborhood,
- 4) \$46,522 to Shingle Creek Community School in the Shingle Creek neighborhood,
- 5) \$103,706 to Sullivan Community School in the Longfellow neighborhood, and
- 6) \$47,460 to Wenonah Community School in the Nokomis East neighborhood.

RECOMMENDATION:
