NOTICE OF HEARING

In respect to your Restaurant license for Bubble Delite, 2515 Nicollet Avenue South, Minneapolis.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE:

1. This is to notify you that a hearing will be held before the Public Safety and Regulatory Services Committee of the Minneapolis City Council on Wednesday, July 13, 2005 at 1:30 p.m. or shortly thereafter, in Room 317, City Hall, 350 South Fifth Street, Minneapolis, MN to consider action with respect to your Restaurant license for Bubble Delite.
2. This hearing may result in revocation of your restaurant license resulting in discontinuance of business activities.
3. An attorney may represent you if you so desire.
4. Pursuant to Minneapolis Charter Chapter 4, the Committee will determine whether or not the license holder is in violation of Minneapolis Code of Ordinances 259.15, failure to pay all fees and fines owed to the City of Minneapolis. Evidence will be presented that Bubble Delite accumulated \$500 in false alarm charges from false alarms recorded on January 21, 2004, February 5, 2004, July 22, 2004 and August 4, 2004.

Further, a notice was mailed, dated April 18, 2005, notifying you that a license cannot be issued when fees are owed to the City.

Minneapolis Charter Chapter 4, Section 16 states, Licenses May be Revoked. Any license issued by the authority of the City Council may be revoked by the City Council at any time upon proper notice and hearing for good cause;...:

Minneapolis Code of Ordinances 259.15, 259.15. Payment of taxes prerequisite to issuance, renewal of license. No license shall be granted, or renewed, for operation on any premises, on which taxes, assessments or other financial claims of the city or of the state are due, delinquent or unpaid. In the event an action has been commenced pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 278, Minnesota Statutes, questioning the amount or validity of taxes, the council may, on application by the licensee, waive strict compliance with this provision; no waiver may be granted, however, for taxes or any portion thereof, which remain unpaid for a period exceeding one year after becoming due unless a payment plan has been entered into or the liability is under litigation or appeal.

This hearing can be avoided by tendering payment in the amount of \$500 to the Business License Department.
