**Approving Laws of Minnesota 2010 Legislative Session; Chapter 255,  
Article 1, Section 2**

Whereas the Minnesota State Legislature has passed a law authorizing the City of Minneapolis to issue an on-sale intoxicating liquor license to the Museum of Russian Art;

Whereas the license authorizes sales by the Museum of Russian Art's concessionaire or operator for a restaurant and catering operator on the premises of the Museum of Russian Art; .

Whereas, said legislation, by its terms requires an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council by the first day of the next regular session of the legislature before it may become effective; and

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the City Council of Minneapolis:

That the said law be now approved and the City Clerk be directed to prepare and file with the Secretary of State the required certification of approval.
