


Potential Local Options

- Public Safety
- Infrastructure
- Energy
- Workforce Training
- Housing



Public Safety

- **Byrne/Justice Assistance (Formula)**
 - Approx. \$6 million up from \$340K
 - criminal justice programming, such as drug task forces, community crime prevention efforts, substance abuse treatment programs, and prosecutorial initiatives, with an emphasis on combating violent crimes.



Public Safety

- **Byrne/Justice Assistance (Competitive)**


- \$225 Million available

- Competitive but targeted to non-formula local units of government

- **Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS)**

- \$1 Billion available

- Fund hiring/rehiring of uniformed officers
- No local match/salary cap
- Maintenance of Effort requirement



Public Safety

- **STOP Violence Against Women**


- \$175 M in formula grants to States

- Law enforcement, prosecution & victim services such as training & technology

- **Transitional Housing Assistance Grants**


- \$50 M in competitive grants

- For victims of violence against women
- Hennepin County eligible applicant




Public Safety

- **FEMA Firefighter Assistance**
 - \$210 M available
 - Competitive grants up to \$15 M
 - Modify, upgrade or construct fire stations
- **FEMA SAFER Personnel Grant**
 - Bill language to allow no match for FY 09/10 awards




Public Safety

- FEMA State & Local Port Security
 - Current grant
 - \$150 M
 - Eligible applicants by invitation




Infrastructure

- Discretionary Grants for National Surface Transportation System
 - \$1.5 Billion
 - Grants of \$20 M to \$300 M
- Highway Infrastructure Investment States and MPOs
 - \$27.5 Billion
 - Funding through State and Met Council




Infrastructure

- Capital Assistance for Transit
 - \$6.9 B
 - Met Council
- Watershed Rehabilitation Program
 - \$50 M
 - Local watershed flood control rehab loans
- Economic Development Assistance
 - US Commerce Dept
 - \$150 M
 - Competitive



Infrastructure

- 
- EPA Superfund
 - \$600 M
 - Leaking Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund
 - \$600 M
 - Brownfields
 - \$100 M
 - Diesel Emission Reduction
 - \$300 M



Energy

- Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant
 - Authorized for 1st time
 - Formula
 - Anticipate \$3.4 M to City through formula
 - \$400 M in competitive set aside
 - Could qualify for state block grant revolving loan fund account



Energy

- Weatherization Assistance Program


- \$5 Billion

- Formula grant to State (MN Dept of Commerce)

- Non-profits deliver local programming

- Household eligibility limit raised to 200% of poverty level


- Households qualify for up to \$6,500 in assistance



Energy

- Alternative Fuel Vehicles Pilot Grants
 - \$300 Million
- State Energy Program
 - \$3.1 Billion
 - Formula to States
 - City may be eligible for subfunding


Workforce Training



- Workforce Investment Act Funds

- Total of \$2.95 Billion in formula grants to States
 - 85% pass thru to local Workforce Investment Boards
 - Adults, Youth, Dislocated
- \$750 Million available in competitive grants for high growth industry training
 - \$500 Million set aside for green jobs
 - Priorities: Health care, broadband, advanced manufacturing

Housing



- **CDBG**


- Approx \$3.75 Million to Mpls
- Projects that can be awarded based on bids within 120 days

- **Neighborhood Stabilization Program**

- \$2 Billion
- Competitive, not formula as with NSP I

- **HOME Investment Partnerships**

- \$2 Billion
- Awards to State Housing Agencies for competitive low income tax credit projects



Housing

- Emergency Shelter Grant
 - To be distributed through formula
 - Approx. \$5.5 Million anticipated to City
 - To be used only for homelessness prevention activities
- Other McKinney Vento Homeless Funds for other partners
 - Schools: \$70 Million via State Pass through
 - Food Shelves: \$100 Million - FEMA Emergency Food & Shelter via State
