In the fall of 2008 the police department was awarded the contract to provide School Resource Officers (SROs) in selected Minneapolis Public Schools. Part of that contract includes the management of the School Patrol program which receives donations for selected activities. For some time, MN AAA has donated money for a School Patrol van. This funding will be used to replace a vehicle that is over ten years old. The police department will pay for the maintenance of the vehicle through an agreement with Public Works Equipment Services Division.
