On December 1, 2010 the Public Safety & Health Committee forwarded the request to City Council without recommendation, and it was subsequently referred back to the committee by Ways & Means. Following discussions on the project, the department is requesting approval for this contract.

The contract is to develop, implement, and evaluate a campaign called "Movement to Change" which will create a social change movement that leads residents to identify with their community as an active, healthy place and persuade them that sustainable, widespread change is dependent on their active involvement in these community-wide efforts. The contractor was identified through a competitive RFP process administered by the Minnesota Department of Health on behalf of the City of Minneapolis and Olmstead County (the second CPPW community that will be contributing funding to this project), and all three organizations will provide funding in support of the campaign through their federal Communities Putting Prevention to Work grant. The total contribution that MDHFS will make to this project is \$457,932 over the remaining grant period until March 18, 2012.
