The purpose of this letter is to request that your Committee approve the 35th and 36th Street Renovation layout, dated April 12, 2002, (attachment A).

Background information:

- These segments were last constructed in 1960's.
- The surface of the roadway is in poor condition.
- There is a section of combined sewer on 36th Street East between Portland and Park Avenues, which requires the construction of a new storm drain.
- The current average daily traffic ranges from 3,600 to 12,200 vehicles.
- This project is within Wards 8, 9 and 10 as well as six neighborhoods including Carag, East Harriet, Lyndale, Kingfield, Central and Powderhorn Park.

The proposed project:

- The purpose of the 35th and 36th Street Renovation projects is to extend and improve the current life of the roadway by resurfacing and addressing major curb and gutter, sidewalk and catch basin deficiencies. There will be spot replacement of curb and gutter, sidewalk and catch basins. Then the existing asphalt surface is milled and overlaid it with new bituminous.
- Engineering Services is doing the design and Field Services will be doing the road and storm drain construction.
- The proposed roadway will continue to function the same as the current conditions with 2 drive lanes (in some locations traffic will continue to be two-way and in others it will be one-way) and 2 parking lanes.
- The roadway width will remain unchanged.
- A new storm drain line will be added on 36th Street East between Portland Avenue and Park Avenue. This line will go down Park Avenue and drain into the proposed Flood pond at 37th Street East and Columbus Avenue South.
- In working with the neighborhood committee the following amenities will be added; striping between the drive lanes and parking for a traffic calming affect, 30 MPH speed limit signs and approximately 70 boulevard trees. These amenities fit within the existing project budget.
- Public Works staff has worked with Council Member Assistants Gay Noble, Jeff Hayden and Andrea Jenkins, as well as the Carag, Lyndale, Kingfield and Central Neighborhoods to complete the proposed layout. Public Works has received verbal approval from all Council Member Assistants and written and verbal approval from the Neighborhood Committee members (attachments B and C).

Scheduling, Costs and Funding

- The construction of this project is scheduled for 2002.
- The estimated cost for the 35th and 36th Street Renovation Project is \$4,638,010. The funding is addressed in the tables below.
