This matter came before the Division of Licenses and Consumer Services at a License Settlement Conference meeting on Friday, March 18, 2011 in Room 1C, Minneapolis City Hall. Appearing on behalf of the Licensee was Dat Le; Owner. Appearing for the City were Linda Roberts; District Supervisor and Michele Olds; License Inspector, Tim Jenkins; Environmental Health Supervisor, and Anne Stahn; Health Inspector. Based on information presented at the meeting, the Division makes the following findings of fact, conclusions, and recommendations:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Village House Que Viet, Inc. has held a Food Restaurant license since at least 1992.
2. The licensee was operating the restaurant without a Certified Food Manager on staff or on site. In addition, not having test strips onsite to monitor sanitation levels resulted in Environmental Health citations.
3. The licensee had \$1600 in outstanding Environmental Health citations.
4. The licensee had \$397.20 in outstanding Pollution Control Annual Billing fees.
5. The licensee had \$160 in outstanding False Alarm fines.

CONCLUSIONS

1. The licensee has obtained the required Food Manager Certification.
2. The licensee paid \$600 toward the Environmental Health citations on March 18, 2011.
3. The licensee paid \$397.20 for the Pollution Control Annual Billing on March 18, 2011.
4. The licensee paid \$160 for the False Alarm fines on March 18, 2011.
5. The remaining outstanding fines due to Environmental Health total \$1000.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Food Restaurant License issued to Village House Que Viet shall be subject to the following conditions:


1. Village House Que Viet staff will enter the self-audit program run through Environmental Health & Food Safety. This training is free and conducted together with the University of Minnesota Extension Service. Que Viet has been contacted by the project coordinator and is currently enrolling in the program. An ongoing self-auditing will be part of this training.
2. The remaining fine amount of \$1000 will be paid by April 22, 2011.

Village House Que Viet, Inc. understands that the holding of a business or liquor license in the City of Minneapolis is both a privilege and a responsibility. A minimum standard shall be met in order to hold such a license. One minimum standard is that a license holder is responsible to ensure that its business operates in compliance with all applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations. It is understood and agreed that any violation of the above Recommendations shall constitute just and proper cause for the immediate imposition of any agreed upon or stayed penalties. It is further understood that compliance with the above Recommendations is a requirement for continuing to hold a license and that failure to comply with any of these conditions may result in additional adverse license action.

I have read and understand the above findings of fact, conclusions, and recommendations. I agree with their contents and I agree with the above noted Recommendations. I understand that the failure of my business to adhere to this agreement may be cause for further suspension, revocation, or denial of my license. I understand that this report must be accepted and approved by the Minneapolis City Council and Mayor.


