Background/Supporting Information

Since September of 2004, staff of Environmental Health/Food Safety has collaborated with staff of Hennepin County in administering a grant titled *Linking Advance Practice Centers and Local Public Health Agencies*. The grant has been funded by the National Association of County and City Health Officials through a grant from the US Centers for Disease Control. The grant application provided for Ramsey and Hennepin Counties and the cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul to plan responses to potential threats to food, water and safety during a disaster or public health emergency.

Hennepin County has recently informed us that they anticipate receiving further funding for this planning via a new grant application to the National Association of County and City Health Officials Advance Practice Center. They are requesting that we proceed with a contract so that they can coordinate activities with the 2004 grant.

We are requesting that the appropriate officials be authorized to conclude a contract with Hennepin County so that city staff may proceed with the Advance Practice Center grant activities.
