

- Fiscal accountability




Mid Year Crime Statistics

- Part One Crime
 - Down 16.66% from last year
 - Down 23.41% from two years ago
 - Down 27.87% from three years ago
- Violent Crime
 - Down 16.75% from last year
 - Down 27.87% from two years ago
 - Down 38.85% from three years ago


Crime Reduction Strategies 2009

Accurate and Timely Intelligence



- Predictive Analysis
 - Focus on *anticipated* trends and patterns
 - Equip patrol officers with needed information
- Improve speed of intelligence delivery
- Network with other agencies to share information



Effective Tactics

- Transition to Minneapolis Police Gang Unit
 - Focused on crime in the city
 - Tied to SICM
 - Focus on prevention, suppression and enforcement
 - Coordinated response from all areas of department to gang crime
 - Partnerships with other agencies



Rapid Deployment of Personnel and Resources




- Improved Response Protocol
 - Three-Tiered Response:
 - Community: Make the community whole and feeling safer and part of the solution.
 - Investigative: Find out who did it and prosecute them.
 - Intelligence: Prevent retaliation and other further crimes.






Relentless Follow Up and Assessment

- Focus CODEFOR process more on results
 - Stop emerging trends and patterns
 - Increase accountability for collaborative efforts with community
 - Assess neighborhood plans in CODEFOR

 - Measurable goals for police and community
 - Progress tracked online and at CODEFOR meetings
 - Planned midyear progress meetings






Developing Meaningful Partnerships

- Improve manner in which the police receive information from the community
 - Use 311 calls more effectively
 - Start mapping community concerns as part of CODEFOR
 - Improve two-way communication via web
 - Continue reaching out to underserved communities
 - Increased community impact statements



Effective Response to Community Concerns



- **Pattern Identification & Response**

- SICM will identify patterns
 - Geographical
 - MO
 - Temporal
- Assigned Identifying Number

- **Accountability**

- Investigations Contact Assigned
- Community Response Coordinator Assigned
 - Inspector, Sector Lt., or CPS
- Mapped at CODEFOR
 - Only cleared when pattern is cleared and community concerns are addressed

Effective Response to Community Concerns



- Major Crime Response
 - SICM will identify serious crimes
 - Anomalies
 - Spike in 311 calls
 - Inquiries by CM, Mayor Office, Community Leaders, Block Club
- Accountability
 - Investigator Assigned
 - Community Response Coordinator Assigned
 - Inspector, Sector Lt., or CPS
 - DC, AC, Chief for citywide issues
 - Intel Coordinator assigned
 - Prevent further violence



Community Response



- **Actions Required**

- Follow up canvass and door knocking
- E-mail alerts pushed to block leaders
- Nixle* or GovDelivery to targeted area with crime alerts / fact sheets
- High visibility / active patrols following incidents

- **Named Official Responsible**


- Will respond to questions or concerns
- Will coordinate media and information response
- Brief / collaborate with appropriate city partners



Gap Analysis-Neighborhood Plans

- Mid year assessment of neighborhood policing plans progress
- For 2010:
 - Greater reach in goals
 - Include neighborhood association contacts and accountability
 - Include collaboration with other city departments and external agencies as a section

Gap Analysis – Reducing Gang Violence

- Focus on prevention
 - Grant application pending: partnership with MAD DADS and Shiloh Temple
 - Work with schools and SROs on gang intervention opportunities in schools
 - Juvenile Division partnerships with PAL, YMCA, Boys & Girls Clubs, etc. on diversion resources



Gap Analysis - Intelligence

- Develop stronger partnerships with other agencies— St. Paul, first ring suburbs
- Collaborate on creating a metro fusion center for intelligence gathering
- Make intel more user friendly for officers
- Increase timely delivery of products,
