Subject: Request for Permission to Accept a DWI Court Grant from the Fourth Judicial District Court

Recommendation: That the proper officials be authorized to execute an agreement with the Fourth Judicial District Court for a portion of the implementation of an Adult DWI Court in Hennepin County to fund wages for police officers to participate in this new program. The grant award to Minneapolis is \$82,000. The Department requests an amendment to the general appropriation resolution for 2009 in the amount of \$82,000. The grant award will operate through the state grant fund, 01600-4002735-321513.
