

While I was working as a member of the Third Precinct Community Response Team (CRT), I was advised by OFFICER MERTEN that he was requesting assistance with the execution of a narcotics search warrant at 1539 26th St E, lower unit. I recognized this address as a problem address. A search warrant was executed at this address on March 15th, 2006. The residents in the neighborhood were complaining about the on-going narcotics activity. I had conducted surveillance at this address and observed several persons coming and going within a short period of time before and after the search warrant on 3-15-2006. People coming and then leaving immediately are consistent with narcotics dealing. One of the persons involved was described as a black male with a stocky build; who was known to officers as AP/1-RECARDO MEEKS who goes by the nick name of "Pac-Man." I was dressed in plain clothes and wearing a t-shirt with "Police" written on the front and back. I was also wearing a raid vest with "Police" written on the front and back. I was wearing a full duty belt. I was in an unmarked vehicle.

During a briefing, I was assigned to the rear perimeter. I arrived to the rear of the 1539 26th St E, lower unit with OFFICER SMITH. We entered through the rear door into 1539 26th St E, lower unit.

I was advised to search the females, Amy Sullivan and Ashley Mitchell, that were inside. I then handcuffed one of these females. I then began to assist with the systematic search of the lower unit.

I assisted OFFICER MERTEN with completing the "page 5".

I transported two juvenile females (A. SULLIVAN and A. MITCHELL) and one juvenile male (BRUCE) to the curfew center. Per OFFICER MERTEN's request, I completed citations for A. Sullivan and for T. Sullivan for disorderly house and curfew. I also completed a citation for Bruce for disorderly house and curfew. I was advised by OFFICER MERTEN that Ashley Mitchell gave the false name of Toni Sullivan.

On the above date and time, I was working as a member of the 3rd Precinct Community Response Team (CRT). I was asked by Officer Merten to assist with a search warrant at 1539 26th street east (the lower unit of an up down duplex). Officer Merten asked me to get into an unmarked vehicle and conduct stationary surveillance on the address prior to the execution of the search warrant. Officer Merten showed my three pictures of the individuals listed in the search warrant. They were identified as Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984, Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981, and Jermaine Corwin Rogers DOB 06-24-1982.

I then took a position of surveillance on the front of the address at approx. 2030 hours. My position of surveillance was in a location where I had a clear view of the north and east sides of the residence. I was able to hear conversations that would take place in the front of the address. It was dark out but I could easily see the activity in the front yard and on the sidewalk due to there being porch lights (spotlights) and street lights.

While watching the address I observed Jermaine Corwin Rogers exit the front door to the lower unit and get into MN GZV779. Rogers then drove the vehicle away from the front of the address, was gone for approx 10-15 minutes, and returned back to the address. I then observed Rogers along with Amy Sullivan exit MN GZV779 and enter into the lower unit of the duplex.

I then observed a Native American male, later known as Josh Bruce, arrive at the address from the west on a bicycle that he left in the front yard. Josh Bruce then entered the lower unit of the duplex.

I then continued the surveillance on the address and observed MN MZT364 arrive in the front of the address with Donald Joseph Meeks as the driver. I observed Donald Meeks go into the lower unit of 1539 26th street east.

During the surveillance I observed Jermaine Rogers exit the front of the address and stand in the front yard and on the front steps. While watching Rogers I observed two different people approach Rogers in the front yard. I then observed Rogers make hand to hand narcotic transactions with these two individuals with an items he retrieved from his pocket in exchange for U.S. currency. The two individuals then left the area and did not return.

I then continued to watch Rogers and he would come and go from the lower unit of the duplex with ease. The front door to the lower level was always left open and the screen door was not locked. I then observed Rogers, Amy Sullivan, and Josh Bruce exit the lower unit front door and approach MN GZV779. All three of these people then got into MN GZV779 and Rogers drove the vehicle away westbound on 26th street east and then southbound on Bloomington avenue south. I advised officers assisting me on the surveillance and they took over the follow on the vehicle. I eventually heard over the Nextel MN GZV779 was stopped and the occupants were detained.

While the other officers were dealing with the occupants of MN GZV779 I observed Donald Meeks coming and going from the lower unit of the duplex (1539 26th street east). While watching Donald Meeks I observed him come and go from MN MZT364.

I also observed foot and vehicle traffic to the address. During a ten minute period I observed several different individuals arrive at the address. I then observed these individuals walk to the front of the address, enter the front yard, and then walk to the rear of the address on the east side of the house. These individuals would stay in the rear of the address for approx 30 seconds to one minute and then walk back to the front of the address, leave the area, and not return.

I then heard over the Nextel that Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan were being released from the stop on MN GZV779. Approx. 5 minutes after hearing this I observed Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan return to the address and run into the lower unit of 1539 26th street east through the open front door.

I then continued to watch the address. While watching the address there were periods of no activity and then it would all of the sudden get extremely busy. During the lull of activity I observed unknown Native American males and females in the front yard. This is a known drug house and I have personally received complaints on this

address about the narcotic dealing from it. While watching these individuals I would observe these individuals come and go from 1539 26th street east, the lower unit.

While watching the address (1539 26th street east) at exactly 2200 hours the activity at the address exploded. In a ten minute period I observed heavy vehicle and foot traffic to the address. I observed at least 15-20 different individuals come to the address, enter the front yard, and walk back to the rear of the address. The individuals would stay at the address for approx. 30 seconds to a minute and then leave the area. At approx. 2220 hours the activity suddenly ceased.

Then at approx. 2230 hours the activity was out of control again. In a five minute period I observed at least 10 more different people come to the address, enter the front yard, and go to the rear of the address. These people again would only stay at the address for approx. one minute and then leave the area. All of this activity is consistent with a narcotic distribution house.

At approx. 2245 hours I observed Donald Meeks exit the front door to the lower unit of the duplex. I then observed Donald Meeks walk over to a vehicle with an unidentified black male and get into a minivan. Donald Meeks was in the minivan for approx. one minute and then exited the minivan and returned to the front of the residence.

I then observed Donald Meeks walk over to MN MZT364. Donald Meeks was then called over to the southwest corner of the intersection of 16th avenue south and 26th street east. I observed Donald Meeks walk to the intersection and meet up with five people. I observed Donald Meeks have a brief conversation with these individuals. I then observed Donald Meeks reach into the rear of his pants and pull an item that I believed to be suspected crack cocaine from his rear buttocks area. I then observed Donald Meeks open a clear plastic bag and remove suspected crack cocaine from it. Donald Meeks then handed the suspected crack cocaine to several of the individuals in exchange for amounts of U.S. currency. I then observed Donald Meeks place the suspected crack cocaine back into the rear of his pants by his buttocks area.

It should be noted through my training and experience I have found that it is extremely common for drug dealers to carry narcotics in between there butt checks in an attempt to avoid detection from the police. This is done due to some officers being uncomfortable with properly searching an individuals groin and buttock area for weapons and/or contraband. I have personally arrested over 30 different people in my career who have attempted this type of concealment.

I then observed Donald Meeks walk back to MN MZT364 and get into the drivers side of the vehicle. Donald Meeks then started the vehicle, drove it westbound on 26th street east, and then northbound on Bloomington avenue south. I aired that Donald Meeks was leaving the address and he was followed out of the area by other unmarked officers. I then heard over the Nextel that Donald Meeks was eventually stopped and arrested for PC Narcotics.

I continued my surveillance on the address and observed Josh Bruce exit the front door of the lower unit of the duplex. I watched as Josh Bruce walked over to 2601 16th avenue south and enter the north door. Minutes later Bruce exited 2601 16th avenue south, returned back to 1539 26th street east, and enter the front door. I then watched as Josh Bruce worked the open front door. I observed two people walking past the front of the address and Josh Bruce called to them. Josh Bruce then asked them if they needed anything. They replied and Bruce directed both of these individuals to the rear of the residence. These two individuals were in the rear of the address for approx. one minute and then returned to the front of the address and left the area.

Josh Bruce was then constantly at the front door. He would go back and forth to the front door and stand inside the front living room. Lt. Thomas advised me over the Nextel that the entry was going to be made into the residence through the front open door. Lt. Thomas advised that it was night time unannounced search warrant. I was then assigned to cover the rear of the address with Officers Nelson and Smith.

The entry team arrived to the west of the address and approached the front of the residence. I then left my position of surveillance and assisted with the rear perimeter of the address. Upon getting into the rear of the address the rear common door was forced open and I entered the residence. I then assisted with securing the basement of the residence.

After the residence was secured, at Officer Merten's request I assisted with a systematic search of the lower level of the duplex. I conducted a search of the basement, bathroom, and hallway linen closet.

During the search I heard Lt. Thomas ask Recardo Meeks if he was in the gang "Makk Mob". Recardo Meeks's response was "I wish I was, those guys have there shit together!"

I then went outside to check the yard and common areas for the residence. While doing this I observed several individuals on the second floor of 2601 16th avenue south watching us through the drawn blinds. They appeared to be fixated on what we were doing and who was going to go to jail.

After the search of the address was completed I cleared the scene.

I am currently the commander of the Third Precinct Community Response Team (CRT). During my tenure in CRT I have been involved in extensive work at Little Earth of United Tribes. I have been able to identify members of Native Gangs at Little Earth and the surrounding area. One of the gangs at Little Earth that has been involved in numerous acts of violence and the dealing of street drugs is the MAKK MOB Criminal Gang. I have also been able to identify members and leaders of the MAKK MOB Gang. One of the leaders of the MAKK MOB is a party who was identified to me a couple of years ago, as RECARDO MEEKS. MEEKS has a nickname of "PAC MAN". I have received reliable information during the past couple of years that MEEKS has been involved in several shooting incidents at Little Earth and the surrounding Phillips Neighborhood. MEEKS was also the victim of an aggravated assault (shooting) in the area of 26th & Longfellow, a few months ago.

CRT Officer Merten has been developing information on MEEKS regarding his extensive drug dealing in the area. Merten was able to gather intelligence information that MEEKS was currently residing at 1539 E. 26th St. I am familiar with this residence/duplex, as the 3rd Precinct CRT Team had executed a narcotics search warrant at that same address a couple of months ago. MEEKS was found out to have recently moved into the lower duplex portion of the residence. Off. Merten was also able to gather intelligence information that MEEKS was dealing significant amounts of crack out of the residence.

On 4/19/06 in the afternoon hours, Off. Merten informed myself and CRT Sgt. Peterson that he was drafting a narcotics search warrant for 1539 E. 26th St. and MEEKS was identified as the main suspect dealing drugs out of the residence. Also identified as taking part in the drug dealing at that location were MEEKS's brother, DONALD JOSEPH MEEKS aka "DMAC". A third party identified was JERMAINE ROGERS.

Off. Merten did obtain a No-Knock Night-Time narcotics search warrant for the address. CRT Officers set up surveillance around MEEKS's residence. CRT Off. Lehner had a good view of the address and called out information to the rest of the CRT Officers. Myself and Off. Merten were a few blocks from the address in a UC vehicle. Off. Merten and Off. Nelson were in separate UC vehicles in the area also. Sgt. Peterson and Off. Nimlos manned a squad car for take-down purposes. Also assisting in a marked squad was Directed Patrol Officer Tony Smith.

Off. Lehner set up surveillance at approx. 2030 hours. He continued to call out his observations. There were over a couple dozens parties who arrived at the residence and had interactions that were consistent with drug dealing. They would arrive by foot or vehicle and spend a very small amount of time at the address and then leave the area.

Off. Lehner observed a juvenile male identified as JOSH BRUCE appear to be working the front door of the residence. It appeared that BRUCE would greet the drug customers out front or at the front door. This continued for a couple of hours. Off. Lehner estimated approx. thirty individuals had approached the residence and had contact with the suspects.

At one point, a known drug dealer, JERMAINE ROGERS was observed leaving the address in a vehicle. Rogers was observed speeding from the scene eastbound on E. 28th St. An investigative stop was made on ROGERS by Sgt. Peterson and Off. Nimlos. During the investigative stop, ROGERS was found to have a suspended license. Due to the fact that ROGERS was involved with the drug operation at the target address, it was imperative that ROGERS be booked HCJ to prevent him from returning to the scene and tipping off the remaining suspects at the scene. He was transported to HCJ by Off. Tony Smith.

We continued with the surveillance on MEEKS's residence. Another identified party in this drug operation was observed leaving the scene in a vehicle. He was identified as DONALD MEEKS. He was followed and an investigative stop was made at approx. 24th and Cedar Ave. So. Making the stop were Sgt. Peterson, and Offs. Nimlos and Smith. I was contacted by Sgt. Peterson and he informed me that DONALD MEEKS was found to be concealing crack in his buttocks.

Throughout the surveillance that occurred from approx. 2030 hrs. to approx. 2300 hours, I contacted St. Paul PD to inquire whether they had an entry team available to make the entry at the target address. Sgt. Peterson also contacted Hennepin City of Minneapolis Rental License

I received a call from MPD SWAT coordinator Otto Wagenpfeil. I gave him details regarding our pending search warrant. I obtained updated information that the MEEKS brothers were not in possession of any handguns on this date. Due to the updated information it was decided that CRT would perform the entry.

A pre-warrant briefing was conducted at a nearby location. During the briefing I made the following entry team assignments: myself as team leader, Sgt. Peterson with the hooligan tool, Off.s Menter and Merten with the ram, and Nimlos with the body bunker. Assigned to the rear perimeter to prevent any fleeing out the back door were Offs. Smith, Nelson, and Lehner.

We proceeded to the target address and approached the front of the address. I found the front outer and inner door open. I proceeded to make entry into the target address, lower unit. As I was entering the address, I announced that it was the police. I immediately observed a party I know as JOSH BRUCE sitting on a chair in the living room. Both myself and Off. Nimlos yelled for him several times to show his hands, as he was concealing them in a cushion on the chair. BRUCE refused to show his hands at which time I had to push BRUCE off of the chair in order to see his hands. I then proceeded to check the rest of the duplex with Off. Nimlos and other CRT Officers. 2 juvenile Native females were detained in the living room, and RECARDO MEEKS was located in the northeast bedroom. MEEKS was detained by other Officers as myself and Nimlos checked the rest of the duplex. When I returned to the bedroom where MEEKS was located, I observed baggies containing suspected crack, where MEEKS had been laying. There was also some misc. cash on the bed.

All of the parties detained were placed in handcuffs and brought out into the living/dining room for biographical interviews. DONALD MEEKS was also brought back to the scene from the stop at 24th/Cedar.

All 5 parties cooperated with the biographical interviews. RECARDO MEEKS advised me that he has been living at the address for approx. a week. He was the only party in the northeast bedroom at the time of entry.

CRT Officers conducted the on-scene searches and interrogations. I was advised by Sgt. Peterson that a little over an ounce of crack was recovered from the location where RECARDO MEEKS was detained. DONALD MEEKS had approx. 3 grams of crack recovered from his person at the time of the stop.

At the completion of the on-scene investigation, the MEEKS brothers were transported and booked HCJ for PC Narcotics. The three juveniles were transported to CTC and processed. The SULLIVAN sisters were tagged at the CTC for Disorderly House, and JOSH BRUCE was processed for PC Narcotics.

The residence was locked up and there were no damages done to the residence at the time of entry.

3 CRT has received ongoing complaints on 1539 26 St E, Minneapolis, and have executed a prior narcotics search warrant at this address on 03-15-06. Furthermore, officers have received specific information from a concerned citizen who wishes to remain anonymous, that a Recardo Meeks was distributing narcotics from the dwelling. Recardo Daryl Meeks, DOB 05-07-1984, is a known cocaine seller with the street name "Pac Man" and a confirmed Vice Lord gang member, and suspected to now be the leader of the "Mac Mob" street gang. I have conducted surveillance on this address and have observed Recardo Meeks enter and exit this address in the past week, and also high numbers of foot traffic consistent with dwellings distributing cocaine. Officers have observed Recardo Meeks driving a blue Caprice Mn license MZT364.

Within the past week I received information from a confidential informant, referred herein as CI, that a person known to him/her as Recardo Meeks was a resident of 1539 26 St E, and was involved in the distribution of cocaine from the dwelling and has observed Meeks in possession of a silver .357 Revolver. I provided the CI with a Booking Photo of Recardo Daryl Meeks, DOB 05-07-1984, and the CI positively ID's this person as the Recardo Meeks, known to sell cocaine at 1539 26 St E. The CI advised me that other suspects involved in the distribution of cocaine from the address were a Jermain Rogers, and another known by the street name "D'Mac". I provided the CI a Hennepin County booking photo of Donald Joseph Meeks, 12-21-1981, and the CI identified this person as the suspect "D Mac". I provided the CI a Hennepin County booking photo of Jermaine Corwin Rogers, 06-24-1982, and the CI identified this person as the suspect Jermaine Rogers known by the CI to sell cocaine at 1539 26 St. The CI further stated that Rogers had gold teeth and had brandished a black, semi-auto, .45 cal handgun, and that Recardo and Donald Meeks will conceal cocaine in their groin area.

I arranged a controlled buy of a quantity of cocaine from occupants inside 1539 26 St E, utilizing the CI. 1539 26 St E is the lower unit of an upper lower duplex. This CI has provided information regarding previous narcotics investigations, which I have corroborated and found to be true and correct. The CI was searched for money and contraband and given a pre-recorded U.S 20.00 dollar bill, serial number AA401930941. I then directed the CI to purchase a quantity of cocaine from occupants in 1539 26 St E. I observed the CI travel to 1539 26 St E, enter the address, and then a short time later, exit and immediately return to my location. I recovered a quantity of white substance from the CI, which field tested positive for cocaine. The CI was searched for money and contraband. The CI advised me that he/she had purchased the cocaine from Recardo Meeks, inside 1539 26 St E.

On 04-19-2006 I briefed officers at the 3rd PCT regarding the above information, providing officers with photos of Donald Meeks, Recardo Meeks and Jermaine Corwin Rogers. At approximately 2030 hours, Lt Thomas, Officers Nelson, Lehner and Menter conducted surveillance on 1539 26 St E, in preparation for execution of a search warrant. Officer Lehner maintained a primary eye on 1539 26 St, and Sgt Peterson, Officers Nimlos and Tony Smith, assisted in marked squads. I obtained a nighttime, no knock, narcotics search warrant for 1539 26 St E, Minneapolis, storage assigned to this dwelling, and the suspect Recardo Meeks, DOB 05-07-1984, signed by Judge Poston. While conducting surveillance, Officer Lehner advised via Nextel that he had Jermaine Rogers and Donald Meeks exit and enter the front entry door to 1539 26 St. At approximately 2130 hours, Officer Lehner advised that Rogers had exited 1539 26 St E, entered a car, Mn license GZV779, which he then drove away. Surveillance followed this vehicle away and Sgt Peterson and Officer Nimlos conducted an investigatory stop at 28th/ Cedar Ave S (MPD CCN 06-99863). Rogers, who was in possession of \$571.00, was arrested for DAS and the car was impounded. Officers advised that there were two other occupants in the car with Rogers, identified as Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan. Both Rogers and Sullivan were released at the scene, and later were found in 1539 26 St E at the time the warrant was executed.

At approximately 2230 hours 3rd PCT CRT officers briefed at a location near 26th/16 Ave, in preparation for the warrant. At this time, Officer Lehner advised that Donald Meeks had exited 1539 26 St, and while on foot near the address, had conducted several suspected drug deals, retrieving suspected narcotics from his buttocks area. Donald Meeks then entered a blue Caprice, Mn license MZT364, which he drove away. Officer Nelson maintained a follow on this vehicle, and Officers Menter and Nimlos and Sgt Peterson conducted a stop at the 55 West ramp at Cedar, where officers recovered a quantity of suspected cocaine from his buttocks area, and a quantity of US currency. The car and Donald Meeks were secured and officers resumed the warrant briefing at approximately 2300 hours. I retained from Officer Menter, the suspected cocaine (a knotted plastic bundle of white substance weighing 3.4 grams with packaging, which I field tested positive for cocaine) and money (\$184.00) recovered from Donald Weeks. Lt Thomas assigned officers for the entry. Officer Menter and I were assigned to ram. I and other officers were wearing raid vests or shirts marked Police front and back.

Upon arrival, officers approached the front of 1539 26 St E and found the front door wide open. Officers entered the dwelling and City of Minneapolis Rental License 65 the threshold I and other officers announced Police Search Warrant.

The front door opened into a living room/dining room area and I observed three parties later identified as Joshua Bruce, Ashley Mitchell and Amy Sullivan. Officers detained them at gunpoint and I continued through the dwelling searching for suspects. I observed officers approach Recardo Meeks, who was laying on a bed in the north bedroom. I continued to the rear of the dwelling, and into the downstairs common area, which was found to be vacant. I then returned to the dwelling. Officers conducted a search of the dwelling. Officers advised that cocaine was located in the north bedroom. I observed there to be two bindles of cocaine on the floor at the south side of the bed and a bindle on the bed. This is the same bed I had observed Recardo Meeks on. Officer Menter recovered the three quantities of cocaine and a baggie of suspected marijuana, along with a quantity of photos, mailings and misc papers, which I retained from him.

Officer Smith transported Donald Meeks back to 1539 26 St E and was detained in the living room with Recardo Meeks, Ashley Mitchell, Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan. Lt Thomas obtained biographical information from each. Mitchell identified herself to Lt Thomas as Toni Marie Sullivan, 11-07-1989, which I later found to be false. I then conducted scales interviews of the arrested parties.

Recardo Meeks and Donald Meeks refused to speak with me and requested their lawyer. I conducted an interview with Josh Bruce, who was 14 years old. Bruce was read his Miranda rights and agreed to speak with me. During the interview, he stated that he was visiting his friend Recardo Meeks. I conducted an interview with Mitchell who identified herself as Toni Marie Sullivan, 11-07-1989. Mitchell was read her Miranda rights and stated that she did not wish to speak with me. I conducted an interview with Amy Sullivan, who was read her rights and agreed to speak with me. Amy Sullivan stated that she was in the front room with Josh Bruce and Toni Sullivan and that Recardo was in the bedroom at the time officers entered the dwelling. Amy advised me that she knows Recardo to go by the name PacMan.

Officer Lehner advised that while conducted surveillance, he observed Josh Bruce flagging down customers as they walked by 1539 26 St E, and could hear him ask them what they needed. Bruce, Mitchell and Sullivan, who are juveniles, were cited for participate in a disorderly house and transported to the Curfew center by Officer Nimlos and Officer Nelson. Officer Tony Smith transported Donald and Recardo Meeks were arrested and booked HCJ for PC Narcotics.

In addition to the mailings and narcotics, I retained a Polaroid brand digital camera, a black lead x-ray vest, digital gram scale, 30.00 US currency, and cell phone from Officer Menter. I retained a 20 dollar bill from Sgt Peterson, recovered from Josh Bruce. I requested that Officer Nelson complete a pg 5, which was left at the scene with a copy of the warrant.

Officers secured the dwelling, locking the entry doors to 1539 26 St E. Officers secured from the scene at approximately 0100 hours.

In review of the evidence, the suspected cocaine recovered from the NE bedroom floor weighed a total of 15.7 grams with packaging which I field tested positive for cocaine. The suspected cocaine recovered from on the bed weighed 1.9 grams with packaging and I field tested positive for cocaine. The mailings/papers included the name Ashley Mitchell and a Mn State in the name of Recardo Meeks. The above evidence was inventoried at the property room.

I obtained a booking photo of an Ashley Louise Mitchell, DOB 06-06-1989, which I found to be the Toni Sullivan arrested at the warrant. A new complaint will be issued in the name of Ashley Mitchell for disorderly house and false information.

STATEMENT OF OFFICER NIMLOS BADGE #5138

On the above date and time, officers from Third Precinct Community Response Team executed a search warrant at 1539 26th Street East, Minneapolis, MN. Prior to the warrant, I was tasked to assist Officer Merten on a search warrant for the lower unit of an up/down duplex for narcotics and weapons. Prior to the execution of the search warrant Officer Merten requested surveillance on the listed address.

For the surveillance, I was assigned to a marked Minneapolis vehicle with Sgt. Peterson wearing raid gear with large white letters spelling "Police" in front and back along with our badges. Officer Lehner was assigned to an unmarked vehicle positioned nearby the address. Prior to the surveillance, Officer Merten briefed us on the sellers involved where seller one was identified as Ricardo Daryl Meeks with DOB of 05-07-1984 who goes by the street name "Pac Man." Seller two was identified as Donald Joseph Meeks with DOB of 12-21-1981 and goes by the street name of "D-Mac." Seller three was identified as Jermaine Corwin Rogers with DOB of 06-24-1982. We were also given descriptions of the vehicles involved and told that the sellers were in possession of a handgun.

During the surveillance, Officer Lehner aired that he observed a black male matching the description of Jermaine Rogers come out of the lower unit and get into a Buick with MN license plate GZV 779 that was parked in front of the listed address and shortly after a juvenile male and juvenile female came out of the listed address and also got into the vehicle. The listed vehicle proceeded to travel westbound on 26th Street and turned south bound on Bloomington Ave. Plain clothes officers conducted a follow in unmarked vehicles before Sgt. Peterson and I positioned our squad behind the vehicle. Once the vehicle was at 28th Street and Bloomington, we were able to position our squad near the vehicle and I observed the listed vehicle turn eastbound on 28th Street at a high rate of speed and traveled eastbound on 28th Street passing several vehicles and changing lanes without signaling. I paced the listed vehicle traveling approximately 45 miles per hour in a 30 mile per hour zone.

Once the vehicle stopped at the intersection of 28th Street and Cedar for the red light I positioned the marked Minneapolis vehicle behind the listed vehicle. It turned southbound on Cedar after the light turned green. After the vehicle made the turn, I initiated a TLE stop and the vehicle pulled over to the shoulder. I approached the driver's side while Sgt. Peterson approached the passenger side. I observed the driver who was identified as Jermaine Rogers talking on a cell phone. We verified that he had a suspended license and was escorted out of the vehicle where he was uncooperative and verbally abusive towards officers. Officers conducted a weapons search and discovered an amount of money along with two cell phones.

After the driver Jermaine Rogers was placed in the rear of the squad, I escorted both passengers out of the vehicle and identified them. The front passenger was identified as Josh Derrick Bruce with DOB of 10-10-1991 and the rear passenger was identified as Amy Reanea Sullivan DOB 07-14-1990. After the juveniles were identified, officers sent them from the scene. Officer Smith arrived at our location and transported AP/Rogers to HCJ for DAS. Prior to being transported, Sgt. Peterson and I counted the U.S. currency located on him which was \$561.00 and issued him a money receipt. Sgt. Peterson and I towed the listed vehicle to the Minneapolis Impound lot.

After the vehicle was towed, Sgt. Peterson and I setup in the area of the listed address to assist with the take down of the listed sellers. At approximately 2245, Officer Lehner aired via Nextel phones that he observed seller "D-Mac" identified as Donald Joseph Meeks with DOB 12-21-1981 leave the address and make several hand to hand exchanges where the seller reached into his butt area and retrieved a quantity of cocaine in exchange for money from unknown persons.

After several exchanges, the seller Donald Joseph Meeks entered the driver seat of MZT364 that was parked in front of the listed address and proceeded to travel westbound on 26th Street and then turned northbound on Bloomington where plain clothes officers proceeded to follow the vehicle. The vehicle then turned eastbound on 24th Street from Bloomington and stopped for the red light at Cedar. Sgt. Peterson and I were able to position our squad behind the vehicle. The vehicle then turned northbound on Cedar from 24th Street and then turned on the entrance ramp to Hiawatha before we initiated a TLE stop with Officer Smith and Officer Menter which the vehicle immediately stopped. Officer Menter escorted the driver Donald Joseph Meeks to the back of the vehicle where he was observed to have a piece of plastic baggie protruding from the driver's side door. I observed a piece of plastic baggie protruding from the driver's side door.

from between his butt cheeks before he flexed his butt cheeks together. Officers were able to handcuff him and then remove a baggie from his butt area that contained suspected cocaine.

After Ap/Donald Joseph Meeks was secured, officers transported him to a nearby location for a briefing. Officers were given permission to execute the search warrant where I was assigned to the entry team on the bunker tool follow by Lt Thomas.

After the briefing, officers traveled to the listed location where we arrived in the alley and approached the front door. I opened the front screen door and found the front door open and I observed a male identified as Josh Bruce in the living room with two females identified as Amy Sullivan and Ashley Mitchell before I announced "police ,search warrant" numerous times and ordered them to the ground where they were secured by trailing officers. I continued through the unit and found a male in the northeast bedroom lying on a mattress located in the middle of the room whom I immediately recognized as the seller Recardo Daryl Meeks with DOB of 05-07-1984 who goes by the street name "Pac Man." I observed a baggie of suspected cocaine and numerous additional plastic baggies on the mattress which is used as packaging material. I observed two other baggies were lying next to the mattress on the floor containing suspected cocaine.

After Recardo Daryl Meeks observed us he then turned to the north portion of the room and appeared to be reaching for something. I placed the bunker tool on body to prevent him from causing harm to officers after he refused my orders to show me his hands numerous times. After pinning him down with the bunker, he still refused to comply with my orders to show his hand where trailing officers secured him while I continued throughout the dwelling. After the dwelling was secured, I secured the basement common area and found it unoccupied.

After the dwelling was secured, officers escorted the occupants to the living room for processing. After the scene was processed, Officer Nelson and I transported Josh Bruce, Amy Sullivan and Ashley Mitchell to the Truancy/ Curfew center for processing.

On 04-19-2006 I was assigned to the 3rd PCT CRT unit investigating narcotics activity in and related to the city of Minneapolis, as a member of the 3rd Precinct Community Response Team (CRT). I was asked by Officer Merten to assist with a search warrant at 1539 26th street east (the lower unit of an up down duplex). Officer Merten asked me to get into an unmarked vehicle and conduct stationary surveillance on the address prior to the execution of the search warrant. Officer Merten showed my three pictures of the individuals listed in the search warrant. They were identified as Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984, Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981, and Jermaine Corwin Rogers DOB 06-24-1982.

I then took a position of surveillance on the front of the address at approx. 2030 hours. My position of surveillance was in a location where I had a clear view of the north and east sides of the residence. I was able to hear conversations that would take place in the front of the address. It was dark out but I could easily see the activity in the front yard and on the sidewalk due to there being porch lights (spotlights) and street lights.

While watching the address I observed Jermaine Corwin Rogers exit the front door to the lower unit and get into MN GZV779. Rogers then drove the vehicle away from the front of the address, was gone for approx 10-15 minutes, and returned back to the address. I then observed Rogers along with Amy Sullivan exit MN GZV779 and enter into the lower unit of the duplex.

I then observed a Native American male, later known as Josh Bruce, arrive at the address from the west on a bicycle that he left in the front yard. Josh Bruce then entered the lower unit of the duplex.

I then continued the surveillance on the address and observed MN MZT364 arrive in the front of the address with Donald Joseph Meeks as the driver. I observed Donald Meeks go into the lower unit of 1539 26th street east.

During the surveillance I observed Jermaine Rogers exit the front of the address and stand in the front yard and on the front steps. While watching Rogers I observed two different people approach Rogers in the front yard. I then observed Rogers make hand to hand narcotic transactions with these two individuals with an items he retrieved from his pocket in exchange for U.S. currency. The two individuals then left the area and did not return.

I then continued to watch Rogers and he would come and go from the lower unit of the duplex with ease. The front door to the lower level was always left open and the screen door was not locked. I then observed Rogers, Amy Sullivan, and Josh Bruce exit the lower unit front door and approach MN GZV779. All three of these people then got into MN GZV779 and Rogers drove the vehicle away westbound on 26th street east and then southbound on Bloomington avenue south. I advised officers assisting me on the surveillance and they took over the follow on the vehicle. I eventually heard over the Nextel MN GZV779 was stopped and the occupants were detained.

While the other officers were dealing with the occupants of MN GZV779 I observed Donald Meeks coming and going from the lower unit of the duplex (1539 26th street east). While watching Donald Meeks I observed him come and go from MN MZT364.

I also observed foot and vehicle traffic to the address. During a ten minute period I observed several different individuals arrive at the address. I then observed these individuals walk to the front of the address, enter the front yard, and then walk to the rear of the address on the east side of the house. These individuals would stay in the rear of the address for approx 30 seconds to one minute and then walk back to the front of the address, leave the area, and not return.

I then heard over the Nextel that Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan were being released from the stop on MN GZV779. Approx. 5 minutes after hearing this I observed Josh Bruce and Amy Sullivan return to the address and run into the lower unit of 1539 26th street east through the open front door.

I then continued to watch the address. While watching the address there were periods of no activity and then it would all of the sudden get extremely busy. During the lull of activity I observed unknown Native American males and females in the front yard of 2601 16th avenue south. This is a known drug house and I have personally received complaints on this address about the narcotic dealing from it. While watching these individuals I would observe these individuals come and go from 1539 26th street east.

While watching the address (1539 26th street east) at exactly 2200 hours the activity at the address exploded. In a ten minute period I observed heavy vehicle and foot traffic to the address. I observed at least 15-20 different individuals come to the address, enter the front yard, and walk back to the rear of the address. The individuals would stay at the address for approx. 30 seconds to a minute and then leave the area. At approx. 2220 hours the activity suddenly ceased.

Then at approx. 2230 hours the activity was out of control again. In a five minute period I observed at least 10 more different people come to the address, enter the front yard, and go to the rear of the address. These people again would only stay at the address for approx. one minute and then leave the area. All of this activity is consistent with a narcotic distribution house.

At approx. 2245 hours I observed Donald Meeks exit the front door to the lower unit of the duplex. I then observed Donald Meeks walk over to a vehicle with an unidentified black male and get into a minivan. Donald Meeks was in the minivan for approx. one minute and then exited the minivan and returned to the front of the residence.

I then observed Donald Meeks walk over to MN MZT364. Donald Meeks was then called over to the southwest corner of the intersection of 16th avenue south and 26th street east. I observed Donald Meeks walk to the intersection and meet up with five people. I observed Donald Meeks have a brief conversation with these individuals. I then observed Donald Meeks reach into the rear of his pants and pull an item that I believed to be suspected crack cocaine from his rear buttocks area. I then observed Donald Meeks open a clear plastic bag and remove suspected crack cocaine from it. Donald Meeks then handed the suspected crack cocaine to several of the individuals in exchange for amounts of U.S. currency. I then observed Donald Meeks place the suspected crack cocaine back into the rear of his pants by his buttocks area.

It should be noted through my training and experience I have found that it is extremely common for drug dealers to carry narcotics in between their butt checks in an attempt to avoid detection from the police. This is done due to some officers being uncomfortable with properly searching an individual's groin and buttock area for weapons and/or contraband. I have personally arrested over 30 different people in my career who have attempted this type of concealment.

I then observed Donald Meeks walk back to MN MZT364 and get into the driver's side of the vehicle. Donald Meeks then started the vehicle, drove it westbound on 26th street east, and then northbound on Bloomington avenue south. I aired that Donald Meeks was leaving the address and he was followed out of the area by other unmarked officers. I then heard over the Nextel that Donald Meeks was eventually stopped and arrested for PC Narcotics.

I continued my surveillance on the address and observed Josh Bruce exit the front door of the lower unit of the duplex. I watched as Josh Bruce walked over to 2601 16th avenue south and enter the north door. Minutes later Bruce exited 2601 16th avenue south, returned back to 1539 26th street east, and enter the front door. I then watched as Josh Bruce worked the open front door. I observed two people walking past the front of the address and Josh Bruce called to them. Josh Bruce then asked them if they needed anything. They replied and Bruce directed both of these individuals to the rear of the residence. These two individuals were in the rear of the address for approx. one minute and then returned to the front of the address and left the area.

Josh Bruce was then constantly at the front door. He would go back and forth to the front door and stand inside the front living room. Lt. Thomas advised me over the Nextel that the entry was going to be made into the residence through the front open door. Lt. Thomas advised that it was night time unannounced search warrant. I was then assigned to cover the rear of the address with Officers Nelson and Smith.

The entry team arrived to the west of the address and approached the front of the residence. I then left my position of surveillance and assisted with the rear perimeter of the address. Upon getting into the rear of the address the rear common door was forced open and I entered the residence. I then assisted with securing the basement of the residence.

After the residence was secured, at Officer Merten's request I assisted with a systematic search of the lower level of the duplex. I conducted a search of the basement, bathroom, and hallway linen closet.

During the search I heard Lt. Thomas ask Ricardo Meeks if he was in the gang "Makk Mob". Ricardo Meeks's response was "I wish I was, those guys have there shit together!"

I then went outside to check the yard and common areas for the residence. While doing this I observed several individuals on the second floor of 2601 16th avenue south watching us through the drawn blinds. They appeared to be fixated on what we were doing and who was going to go to jail.

After the search of the address was completed I cleared the scene.

Prior to the execution of the search warrant at 1539 E 26th St, I assisted other CRT officers with two separate traffic stops.

The first was near 2826 Cedar Av S. I assisted OFFICER NIMLOS and SGT PETERSON by taking custody of JERMAINE CORWIN ROGERS and booking him into HCJ for D.A.S. I also presented JERMAINE ROGERS with a money/property receipt in the amount of \$561.00.

After this booking, I assisted OFFICER NIMLOS with another vehicle stop. This was near the Cedar Av/Hiawatha Av on ramp. Myself and OFFICER MENTER activated the emergency equipment in our marked squad and stopped MN: MZT364. The driver/sole occupant was DONALD MEEKS. It was brought to my attention that DONALD MEEKS was possibly concealing drugs in the area of his rear buttocks.

After the vehicle was stopped, DONALD MEEKS was escorted from the vehicle and proned out onto the ground. I observed that DONALD MEEKS had what looked plastic baggie material sticking out of his butt cheeks. This baggie was recovered and contained suspected cocaine. DONALD MEEKS was placed under arrest and secured in the backseat of my squad.

On 04-19-2006 I was assigned to the 3rd PCT CRT unit investigating narcotics activity in and related to the city of Minneapolis. I was working in a plain clothes capacity. I was requested by Officer Merten to assist with a narcotics investigation with a possible search warrant at 1539 26th Street East, which was the lower unit of an up down duplex. I was requested to drive an unmarked police vehicle to the area and park it, leaving Officer Lehner in the unmarked police vehicle to conduct surveillance on the above location. Officer Merten gave Officers involved with the detail information on the suspects, that the suspects were suspected of selling cocaine, that the three main suspects were suspected of being armed, that at least one of the suspects (Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984) was a recent suspect in an assault, vehicles that the suspects were suspected of driving and that at least one of the suspects, (Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981) was suspected of concealing cocaine in his buttocks area. Officer Merten showed Officers pictures of Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984 ("Pac Man"), Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981 ("D Mac"), and Jermaine Corwin Rogers DOB 06-24-1982 ("Maine"). Officers involved with the detail maintained contact via department issued Nextels.

~~After parking the unmarked Police vehicle, with Officer Lehner in the unmarked Police vehicle, I walked North on 16th Ave~~
 from 26th Street until I was picked up by LT Thomas, who was driving an unmarked Police vehicle. LT Thomas and I parked near the above location monitoring Officer Lehner call out information and activity related to the investigation. Officer Lehner called out that Rogers came out the front door of the lower unit and got into MN GZV779 and drove away. About 10 minutes later Officer Lehner called out that Rogers returned back to the above location, driving MN plate GZV779, and was in the company of a young Native American female and went back into the lower unit. Officer Lehner continued to update Officers and the activity related to the address, which included hand to hand transactions.

Officer Lehner called out that Rogers, a Native American male, and a Native American female came out the front door and got into MN plate GZV779 and drove away. Officer Lehner called out that Rogers was the driver of MN plate GZV779. LT Thomas and I followed MN plate GZV779 as it travelled South on Bloomington Ave and then turned East on 28th Street. Officer Nelson, driving an unmarked Police vehicle, assisted with the follow until it was stopped by Sgt Peterson and Officer Nimlos in the 2800 block of Cedar Ave So. Sgt Peterson and Officer Nimlos were in a marked squad when they made the stop.

~~After MN plate GZV779 was stopped LT Thomas and I returned back to a location in the area of 1539 26th Street East.~~
 Officer Lehner continued to update Officers and the activity related to the address, which included hand to hand transactions involving Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984 and Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981. Officer Lehner called out that Donald Joseph Meeks DOB 12-21-1981 would come and go from MN plate MZT364. Officer Lehner called out that Donald Meeks reached into the rear of his pants and pulled out an item that he believed to be suspected cocaine from his rear buttocks area. Officer Lehner called out that Donald Meeks opened a clear plastic bag and removed suspected cocaine from it and hand the suspected cocaine to several individuals in exchange for amounts of U.S. currency. Officer Lehner called out that Donald Meeks placed the suspected cocaine back into the rear of his pants by his buttocks area.

It should be noted through my training and experience I have found that it is common for drug dealers to carry and conceal narcotics in their butt cheeks in an attempt to avoid detection from the police. I have been involved with numerous investigations and recovered cocaine and other contraband from the butt cheeks of people involved with this type of activity.

As Officers met at a nearby location in preparation of executing the search warrant obtained by Officer Merten, Officer Lehner called out that Donald Meeks walked to MN plate MZT364 and got into the drivers seat of the vehicle and drove away. I got into a marked Police vehicle driven by Officer Smith and assisted with the follow and stopping of MN plate MZT364 on the on-ramp from Cedar Ave and Hiawatha Ave. Donald Meeks was the sole occupant of MN plate MZT364. Sgt Peterson and Officer Nimlos assisted with the stop.

I approached the drivers door and ordered Donald Meeks to place the car in park and get out of the car. Donald Meeks asked why he was being stopped and I told him that he was a suspect in a narcotics investigation. Donald Meeks did not get out of the car as ordered so I placed the car in park and escorted Donald Meeks out of the car and placed him on

the ground so that he could be searched and handcuffed. While I had Donald Meeks on the ground, on his stomach, he attempted to place his hands down the rear of his underwear. When Donald Meeks went to the ground his loose fitting pants had come down below his buttocks, exposing his underwear. Donald Meeks attempted to place his hands down the back of his underwear and I pulled them out and placed handcuffs on him.

Sgt Peterson, Officers Nimlos and Smith were standing over me and Donald Meeks. I told Sgt Peterson that I believed that Donald Meeks was concealing cocaine in his buttocks area and was given permission to search his buttocks area. Because of where we stopped MN plate MZT364, on the on-ramp, and the fact that the marked squads were blocking traffic we had a great deal of privacy. I pulled up the underwear of Donald Meeks and sticking out between his buttocks was clear cellophane plastic. I placed a pair of latex gloves on my hands, which I had inside of one of my raid vest pockets, and removed the baggie from Donald Meeks buttocks area. Inside of the plastic baggie recovered from Donald Meeks was a white substance that I believed to be cocaine. I removed my latex gloves from my hands turning them inside out leaving the suspected cocaine on the inside of them to protect myself and other people from any possible body fluids from Donald Meeks. I completed the search of Meeks which consisted of \$184.00 in U.S. currency and a small bifold wallet. I maintained custody of these items and turned them over to Officer Merten. Officer Smith and I placed Donald Meeks in the rear of our squad and transported him back to a nearby location in preparation of executing the search warrant.

During the briefing LT Thomas assigned me to the entry team on the ram tool with Officer Merten. I was told that it was a daytime/nighttime unannounced warrant. It was determined that entry would be made through the front door. I was still wearing my ballistic raid vest that had the word "Police" clearly displayed on the front and rear of the vest over my plain clothes. I drove to the above location in an unmarked Police vehicle with Sgt Peterson and Officers Nimlos and Merten.

As we approached the front door of the above location I saw that the screen door was shut but the two inside doors were wide open. We entered the lower unit and I saw a young Native American male and two young Native American females seated in the livingroom. They were ordered to the floor at gunpoint and I followed Officer Nimlos to the rear of the 2 bedroom apartment. The two bedrooms were located on the East side of the apartment.

As we entered the North East bedroom we found Recardo Daryl Meeks DOB 05-07-1984 lying on a mattress which was on the floor. The head of the mattress was up against the East wall of the bedroom and had about an even amount of space between the North and South wall of the room. As we entered the bedroom it seemed as though we caught Recardo Meeks by surprise. We ordered Recardo Meeks to show us his hands but instead he rolled over to his right, to the north side of the bed and acted as if he was reaching for something. He ignored the commands to show his hands and stop going toward the edge of the bed. Officer Nimlos used the bunker to secure Recardo Meeks until I was able to take control of Recardo Meeks and handcuff him.

Laying on top of the bed where Recardo Meeks was lying was a clear cellophane baggie that contained a quantity of suspected cocaine, a clear cellophane baggie containing suspected marijuana, and other contraband. There was also a quantity of loose U.S. currency on top of the mattress. There was a single key on the mattress as well. Laying on the floor on the South side of the mattress were two more cellophane baggies containing suspected cocaine. Recardo Meeks was the only person in the North East bedroom. Recardo was handcuffed and escorted out of the bedroom. The above described evidence was recovered and turned over to Officer Merten.

While searching the North East bedroom I recovered several mailing and misc paperwork, 2 wrist watches and other items of contraband. While searching the top middle drawer of buffet in the diningroom I recovered an electronic, digital style scale. I turned over the above described property to Officer Merten.

On 04-19-2006, I was assigned to the 3rd Precinct Community Response Team (CRT). Officer Merten conducted an investigation and obtained a narcotics search warrant for the residence 1539 East 26th Street. Officer Merten investigation identified Ricardo Daryl Meeks (AKA PAC-MAN), DOB 05-07-1984, and Donald Joseph Meeks (AKA D-Mac), DOB 12-21-1981 as selling crack cocaine from the residence. Additionally, Officer Merten listed MN License/ MZT364 in his warrant as a suspect vehicle.

Officer Lehner conducted pre-warrant surveillance at the residence 1539 east 26th Street and communicated observed activity via Nextel. Prior to serving the warrant, Officer Lehner observed suspect/ Donald Joseph Meeks make a sale of suspected crack cocaine outside the residence. Via Nextel, Officer Lehner advised Officers that the suspect/ Donald Joseph Meeks removed the contraband from his buttocks area. Additionally, Officer Merten investigation indicated the sellers Ricardo Daryl Meeks and Donald Joseph Meeks were known to conceal narcotics in the area of their groin.

Communicated via Nextel, Officer Lehner observed the suspect/ Donald Joseph Meeks enter and assume operation of MN License/ MZT364. Donald Joseph Meeks was the driver and lone occupant of the vehicle. Officer Nelson followed MN License/ MZT364 away from the residence. Officer Nimlos (Driver) and I (passenger) manning marked squad 394 responded to the area to stop the vehicle, MN License/ MZT364.

Officer Nimlos and I pulled in behind MN license/ MZT364 and activated our red lights and siren. This stop was performed on the Northbound Hiawatha on-ramp at Cedar Avenue South. Upon activating our lights and siren, Donald Joseph Meeks brought his vehicle to a quick and abrupt stop. Officer Nimlos, I exited our squad and the defendant vehicle began to roll backwards toward our squad and stopped within a couple of feet.

I observed assisting Officers escort Donald Joseph Meeks from his vehicle and noticed the defendants pants and boxer type shorts were pulled half-way down, which exposed his buttocks. Officers Nimlos indicated Donald Joseph Meeks was attempting to conceal contraband in the area of his buttocks. Donald Joseph Meeks was placed on the roadway lying on his stomach.

Officers Merten investigation revealed Donald Joseph Meeks and Ricardo Daryl Meeks were known to conceal contraband in the area of their groin, which was corroborated by Officer Lehner surveillance observations. I could see Donald Joseph Meeks was clenching his partially exposed butt cheeks together.

Based on the observed conduct of Donald Joseph Meeks, coupled with investigative intelligence, I authorized and witnessed assisting Officer Menter recover a clear baggie that contained a quantity of suspected crack cocaine from between Donald Joseph Meeks butt cheeks. Officer Merten later field-tested the recovered crack cocaine that yielded a positive result with an approximate weight of 3.4-grams.

Due to exigent circumstances and to prevent the destruction of evidence, the search was conducted on the roadway with the defendant person shielded by assisting Officers for privacy. It should be noted, at the location and time of the search, no bystanders were observed in or around the area.

Following the arrest of Donald Joseph Meeks a pre-warrant briefing was conducted at a nearby location. During this briefing, I was assigned to the Entry team by Lieutenant Thomas and responsible for the Hooligan tool. Concluding this briefing, Officers proceeded to the warrant location to serve the warrant.

Upon arrival, Entry Officers and I approached the front of the residence. Officers approached the front of the residence and verbally announced our presence "Police!" followed by our lawful purpose "Search Warrant!" The front common door and exterior door of the residence were standing open.

Entry Officers and I entered the front living room and proceeded into the residence verbally announcing ourselves. I held my position in the living room and covered the three-occupants until the rest of the residence had been secured. I then secured AP-3/ Josh Derrick Bruce and Amy Renea Sullivan in handcuffs. Officer Nelson secured Toni Marie Sullivan. During a search of AP-1/ Bruce person, I recovered a twenty-dollar bill from his pants pocket. The currency was turned over to Officer Nelson. I also recovered a pre-recorded buy funds.

I observed AP-1/ Ricardo Daryl Meeks in the North bedroom of the residence. In the North bedroom, in plain view, I observed several clear baggie that contained suspected crack cocaine. I was later advised by Officer Merten that the recovered crack cocaine field-tested positive with a combined weight of approximately 17-grams. For further details, refer to assisting Officers reports.

Officers then preformed a systematic search of the residence. In concluding our on-scene investigation, the adult defendants were transported to HCJ and the Juveniles to the curfew center.

It should be noted, I drove MN License/ MZT364 to the 3rd Precinct station. Officer Menter contacted the auto desk, prepared a tow sheet, and impounded the vehicle.
